### 3.0 Background

- 3.1 These are a number of Standard Temporary Event Notices in relation to a festival known as Shuffle.
- 3.2 The festival is being held in various areas of Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park with additional spaces at Underground Car Park and Women's Workhouse, both in Southern Grove.
- 3.3 The Licensing Authority has received a total of 17 Standard Tens for the event being held between 4<sup>th</sup> August and 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017.
  - A restaurant operating with alcohol for the period 4<sup>th</sup> August to 27<sup>th</sup> August excluding Monday and Tuesdays.
  - The main festival event on the weekend of August Bank Holiday of 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017.

A schedule of those TENs is attached in **Appendix 1**. See also paragraph 6 of the report on limits

3.4 A time limited premises licence exists for Tower Hamlets Cemetery which is limited through conditions to a maximum of 15 event days per calendar year. It is understood this licence will only be utilised on 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017. The timings of this licence are as follows:

### The supply of alcohol (both on and off sales)

- Sunday to Thursday from 11:00hrs to 22:30hrs
- Friday and Saturday from 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs

The provision of regulated entertainment in the form of plays (both indoors and outdoors), films (both indoors and outdoors), live music (both indoors and outdoors), recorded music (both indoors and outdoors) and anything of a similar description.

• Sunday to Thursday from 11:00hrs to 22:30hrs

• Friday and Saturday from 11:00hrs to 23:00hrs **Opening Times:** 

- Sunday to Thursday from 07:00hrs to 23:00hrs
- Friday and Saturday from 07:00hrs to 23:30hrs

Alcohol and Regulated Entertainment 26<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017 – See **Appendix 6** 23:00 hrs to midnight Saturday; 22:30hrs to midnight Sunday

### e) Music Pavilion/Memorial Glade

Alcohol and Regulated Entertainment 26<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017 – See **Appendix 7** 23:00 hrs to midnight Saturday; 22:30hrs to midnight Sunday

### f) Cantrell Field

Alcohol and Regulated Entertainment 26<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017 – See **Appendix 8** 23:00 hrs to midnight Saturday; 22:30hrs to midnight Sunday

### g) Womens Workhouse

Regulated Entertainment 26<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017 – See **Appendix 9** 12:00 hrs to midnight

### h) Scaffold Yard

Alcohol and Regulated Entertainment 26<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> August 2017 – See **Appendix 10** 12:00 hrs to midnight

(The applicant informed the Licensing Authority that the site is now not viable, however the Application has not been withdrawn and objections remain)

3.6 A map showing the site and the festival plan is included as **Appendix 11.** Photos have been taken of parts of the site following a site visit; these will be provided on the night.

### 4.0 **Temporary Event Notices**

- 4.1 Temporary Event Notices (TENs) are a creation of the Licensing Act 2003. They provide a method by which licensable activities can be carried out on a temporary basis (max. 168 hrs) without a licence. The maximum number that can attend at any one time is 499. At least 10 full working days notice must be given to the licensing authority. When a TEN cannot be obtained, for example the event is over 499, then a full premises licence must be obtained, for a limited duration.
- 4.2 The licensing authority cannot oppose an application, (nor can local residents or businesses. The licensing authority must reject any application that does not meet the rules as to numbers, maximum per year etc. The limits are now as follows: 15 TEN per calendar year or 21 days. The responsible authorities that can object is the Metropolitan Police or Environmental Protection.
- 4.3 The Police and Environmental Protection can object on the grounds that allowing the event to go ahead will undermine one of the Licensing Objectives.
- 4.4 Following an objection by the relevant responsible authority one or more conditions may be imposed by the Licensing Authority
  - (a) if it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so,
  - (b) the conditions are also imposed on a premises licence or club premises certificate that has effect in respect of the same premises, or any part of the same premises, as the temporary event notice, and
  - (c) the conditions would not be inconsistent with the carrying out of the licensable activities under the temporary event notice.
- 4.5 Where the authority decides to impose one or more conditions;
  - (a) the authority must give the premises user notice of the decision;
  - (b) the notice must be accompanied by a separate statement (the "statement of conditions") which sets out the conditions that have been imposed on the temporary event notice; and
  - (c) a copy of the notice and statement of conditions must be given to each relevant party.
- 4.6 LATE TENs have been created through the Police Reform and Social Responsibilities Act 2011, a Late TEN can be made no later than FIVE working days and no earlier than NINE working days before the event. The limits to these applications are no more than 2 for a non personal licence holder or no more than 10 for a personal licence holder.
- 4.7 The Police and Environmental Protection can object to Late TENs, if an objection is made the Licensing Authority must issue a counter notice advising the event cannot take place.

### Advice to Members

- 5.5 The Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 have amended legislation whereby Environmental Protection alongside Police can object to Temporary Event Notice under any of the licensing objectives.
- 5.6 This hearing is required by the Licensing Act 2003. As always the decision is on the civil burden of proof, i.e. the balance of probability.
- 5.7 Members can consider any of the licensing objectives. Other matters can also be dealt with elsewhere by primary legislation.

- 5.8 Premises users are not required to be on the premises for the entire duration of the event authorised by the TEN, but they will remain liable to prosecution for certain offences that may be committed at the premises during the period covered by it. These include, for example, the offences of the sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk; persistently selling alcohol to children; and allowing disorderly conduct on licensed premises.
- 5.9 The police or local authority exercising environmental health functions may contact the premises user to discuss their objections and try to come to an agreement which will allow the proposed licensable activities to proceed. The TEN can be modified. If there is no agreement, the licensing authority must hold a hearing to consider the notice.

### 6.0 Temporary Event Notice Limits

- 6.1 Section 100 (5) (d) of the Licensing Act 2003 refers to limits on numbers: "the maximum number of persons (being a number less than 500) which the premises user proposes should, during those times, be allowed on the premises at the same time"
- 6.2 On referring to Patersons it makes reference to the above limit; "It would seem that this figure shall include members of staff and any other persons present upon the premises. There has been a suggestion that the provision could be used to licence events catering for significantly more than the permitted 500 persons by the simple expedient of arranging for the licensable activities to take place in discrete individual locations across one main site. Whilst such an arrangement has yet to come before the High Court, it is our view that such a transparent attempt to circumvent the public consultation and controls attendant upon an application for a premises licence would be likely to be interpreted as falling outside the provisions of s 100, in much the same way as efforts of certain operators to create multiple 'premises' under the Gambling Act 2005 (to secure the maximum benefit from their gaming machines allowance) has recently been condemned by the Gambling Commission in its amended guidance on so called 'split premises'."

### 7.0 Legal Comments



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### **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended
- 1.
- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises;
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

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- 3.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 5. 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
  - 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
    - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
    - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$

where —

- (i) **P** is the permitted price
- D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

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- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, such individuals must be licensed with the Security Industry Authority.

This does not apply to premises within paragraph. 8(3) (a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001, (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or

in respect of premises in relation to-

any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3) (b) or (c) of Schedule 2 (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or any occasion within paragraph 8(3) (d) of Schedule 2 (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act) unless the Licence specifically states otherwise.

Security activity means an activity to which paragraph 2(1) (a) of Schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 of that schedule applies, and

Paragraph 8(5) of Schedule 2 (interpreting of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of Schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001

Where the exhibition of films is authorised, the admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be to be restricted as follows: If the London Borough of Tower Hamlets Licensing Section has issued a particular notification of restriction to the licence holder, that restriction must be adhered. Otherwise the recommendation of the film classification body must be followed. Children means persons aged under 18 and "film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (currently the British Board of Film Classification)

### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

- 1. Full and detailed consultation will be undertaken by the Premises Licence holder with each of the responsible authorities. This consultation will take place through Event Planning Group or multi-agency meetings in the lead up to the event and during the event itself;
- 2. An Event Safety Management Plan (ESMP) containing detail appropriate to each year's Event will be produced and implemented in consultation with and with the agreement of the Responsible Authorities through multi-agency or Event Planning Group meetings;
- 3. Entry to any unauthorised/disorderly person will be refused by means of screening on the entry points to the event;
- 4. A "zero tolerance to drugs" policy will be implemented;
- 5. In conjunction with metropolitan police service and other relevant stakeholders, each year the licence holder will produce;
  - a) Crowd Management, Security & Stewarding Plan
  - b) Alcohol Management Plan
  - c) Egress Plan
  - d) Crime Reduction Plan
- 6. Each year the licence holder will produce the following Health & safety documents, which will be made available to the responsible authorities prior to the event;
  - a) Risk Assessment
  - b) Fire Risk Assessment
  - c) Schedule of Temporary Structures
  - d) Questionnaire and Inspection schedule for Food Traders

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e) Rules for Site contractors

- 7. The premises licence holder will notify local residents in advance of any events;
- 8. A telephone number of an event manager will be made available to local residents during events;
- The event managers and organizers will comply with any reasonable request made by the Police event command team during the course of the event;
- 10. A Challenge 21 Policy shall be implemented, so that before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth, and a holographic mark is checked. This will include, for example:
  - a) A photo car driving licence
  - b) A passport
  - c) A proof of age card bearing the PASS hologram
- 11. The licence shall be used for a maximum of 15 event days per calendar year;
- 12. Event dates to be agreed by the Licensing Authority and responsible authorities and once agreed publicised at least two months prior to the event;
- 13. Substantial food and non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available at all times;
- 14. Staff members shall regularly patrol and monitor all areas when licensable activities are taking place;
- 15. Appropriate fire safety equipment will be provided during events;
- 16. Signage shall be displayed at exits requesting customers to leave the area quietly. Staff shall remind customers to leave the area quietly;
- 17. As relevant, no noise from regulated entertainment shall be audible at any affected facade and/or inside any premises with the window ajar so as to cause a nuisance

The eleven TENs are all part of the Shuffle Festival. The use of TENs does not allow local residents to consider their proposals

I believe the midnight terminal hour is likely to cause a nuisance to local residents whether it is from the entertainment or people under the influence of alcohol

In regards to the Scaffold Yard, the licensable activities will take place in the uncovered yard. Music at this time of night will cause a public nuisance.

I'm concerned that the area such as the Pond Bar has no SIA. I know this has been addressed by Sgt Warlow as he has concerns about youths on mopeds on the pathway. I am concerned about their patrons being victims of crime in the park or when leaving at midnight. I have already discussed with the organisers the need to increase their SIA levels.

Is there a need for off sales?

I would ask the applicant to consider the following;

Licensable activities: 2300 finish, closing 2330

There is another meeting soon, where hopefully these concerns will be addressed.

I attended the location with LBTH officers and managed to gain access to the adjoining school and overlook the venue.

As described at a meeting the following day it looked like a jungle. The outer area had a large amount of shrubbery and substantial trees. I couldn't see whether the ground was even or whether there was any other items that may have been of concern.

. At the meeting at Mulberry Place on the 1st August 2017, the organisers said that the external area will be made safe prior to the festival. At the moment this cannot be verified.

The organisers have also said that a second entry/exit point will be added. The availability of another exit would increase capacity but as of yet this has still to be done.

The hours remain a concern and I have discussed this the noise officer. We believe licensable activities should finish at 2300.


with consideration Low Frequency levels. In open air venues low frequency content of the music can be more disturbing at a distance from the event location. A level of 65dB in either 63Hz or 125Hz octave band may be satisfactory for this location. Having spoken to Mark at Hark Audio (shown on the noise management plan), they are only providing the Audio equipment, and not undertaking noise monitoring on site.

I am hopefully that in the last Shuffle SAG meeting that agreement can be met and further details of the Applicants NMP will be provided.

Hi Kathy,

Following the last Safety Advisory Group (SAG) meeting with the applicant on the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2017, attended by representatives from the Police, Licensing, Arts and Events, Health & Safety & the London Fire Brigade, I have further considered the TENs applications for the for Shuffle Film festival and the potential impact of public nuisance and measures to prevent noise generated from within the premises or outside it which could cause disturbance to people in the vicinity.

At the SAG meeting, having previous asked for details of what noise mitigation measures they have in place to minimise noise impact from the event on residents, the applicant was unable to advise of any details and to date I have yet to receive confirmation of this.

When advised that they needed a noise consultant preferable from the Institute of Acoustic or Association of Noise Consultants, I was informed that they were not aware of this and that last year they used a noise app on their phone, which does correlate (see folder attached) with the fact that I met their Acoustic Engineer on site last year and my Colleague Michael Dunn went to the pre event sound checks (see folder attached)

Another discrepancy is the fact that when I mentioned using headphones to listen to films after 11pm, I was advised by the applicant that these were not used last year. However an email from their legal representative on 16.6.16 last year (see folder attached) I was advised that that entertainment will either use headphones as requested or not be licensable, and at all times (pre and post 11pm) the entertainment will be appropriately controlled.

Having contacted Hark Audio last week, the Company on the Noise Management Plan for PA and Sound for Shuffle 2017, I spoke to Mark (who happened to undertake the sound monitoring for Shuffle last year), and he advised me this year he was only supplying the Sound System, but was not undertaking Sound Testing this year, as he no longer had a Sound Level Meter.

Due to the discrepancies in information, and the fact that the applicant has yet to provide me with the required information to assess whether they are taking sufficient steps this year to minimise and monitor to noise levels from their event, I do not feel confident in the Noise Management of the Event, and hence do not consider that at this time that the License Objectives for the Prevention of Public Nuisance will be adhered to.

Therefore my objection still holds relating to:-

Area 4 - Horse Chestnut Glade, Area 5 - Music Pavillion & Memorial Glade, Area 6 - Cantrell Field. However, if the Applicant provides sufficient evidence, to show steps/methods are being taken to minimise noise impact to local residents I would consider withdrawing my objections.

With regards to the Area 9 – Railway Yard & Area 2 the Women's Workhouse both Pc Cruickshank and I would agree: Licensable activities until 2300 hours, closing at 23:30 (and not as per the application until Midnight, with Premises closing at 00:30).

**Noise Sensitive premises:** residential in close proximity to Tower Hamlets Cemetery Park including in Steadman House, Lockhart Street, Bow Common Lane including Loweswater House, and Brockesley Street.

In my view the application, as it stands fails, to comply with the objective of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to "public nuisance" for the following reasons:-

- Noise breakout from the venue affecting neighbouring residents.
- Access & egress to and from the venue, of patrons, especially due to patrons likely to be in high spirits; and
- The hours of operation (inclusive of proposals)

### **CONCLUSION**

Environmental Protection **does not** support the applications for Shuffle Tower Hamlets Cemetery including Horse Chestnut Glade, Music Pavilion & Memorial Glade and Cantrell Field, Women's Workhouse & Railway Yard, as there is great likelihood of disturbance to residential premises at the noise sensitive hours sought. However I am willing to withdraw my objections if the required noise management details are provided and the Applicant is willing to reduce the hours for the Women's Workhouse and the Railway Yard.

Thank you for arranging the meeting it was helpful to understand from being on site, how the event will operate.

However I do not believe that the Licensing Objective for the Prevention of Public will not be met from two aspects of your event as follows:

- (1) The films on two sectors of the Park until 2am because despite advising that the noise levels will be background level, late at night & early hours of the morning background noise levels will already be low (the area itself is a quiet area), so the use of headsets will be required whilst watching the films after 11pm.
- (2) As your event goes into noise sensitive times of night the sound from the foghorn is likely to cause a noise disturbance to residential premises in close proximity, and possibly further a field, and therefore I cannot agree to the foghorn being used after 22:30 hours of night.



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
