The whole address of the business will be used: both the coffee shop and HWK Bar, along with its court yard to the rear.

HWK Bar is a licensed small cocktail and wine bar, which accommodates seating and standing with DJs on the weekend during licensed hours. During this particular weekend the activities will be the same, except we wish to extend the hours of the premises for Halloween weekend. HWK coffee will also be used to accommodate extra space for the "event" / weekend's proposed extended hours. There is also a courtyard to the rear of both the coffee shop and the cocktail / wine bar, which is enclosed from the road. This area also has a bar area with additional outdoor heating and also acts as the smoking area.

The whole premises is a versatile and unique space and although only recently open, has attracted a regular, diverse and discerning clientele with interests in the higher end aspects of music, art, drinking and dining, as is reflected in the array of cocktails, wine and drinks; and music on offer from our DJs.

We intend to mark out the calendar with several dates, where we would like to celebrate the establishment beyond our regular licensing hours. With our well planned out noise management plan; "Polite Solution Ltd" security (who also manage security for neighbouring venues Crate, The Yard, Mick's Garage, Beer Merchants Tap and Bloc); our experience and clientele, we feel confident in doing so with no issues. This TEN is for Halloween. There will be a little bit more promotion than usual: a facebook event, special guest DJs and later finish. We will also be utilising our adjacent coffee shop.

DJs will be playing recorded music on the Friday from 7pm (normal start time for the resident DJs) until 2am (finish time on this TEN for the Friday); then from 6pm - 4am in HWK Bar on the Saturday night / Sunday morning and 9pm - 1am in HWK coffee shop on the Saturday night / Sunday morning.

The sounds will be restricted (as in accordance with our submitted sound management plan), due to the nature of the ingress and egress of the premises; black wool serge drape just in front of the gated entrance to the premises (main entrance for everybody on the day and night); double glazed windows across the front of the coffee shop and bar (along with black wool serge acting as curtains); there will also be an additional black wool serge curtain just after the exit doors from HWL bar to the courtyard. Please see attached sound management plan docs in e-mail to all relevant authorities (including sketched layout).

There will also be signage at the exit requesting guests be quiet on leaving in to taxis or walking home. The security on the exit door will also emphasise this to guests on them leaving. To manage the flow of people and further mitigate against any noise disturbance, the middle, gated entrance will be the only formal entrance for guests to the premises. From there,

guests can access the courtyard directly, HWK bar on the right and the coffee shop from it's rear. The coffee shop door to the street will remain permanently closed, which will mitigate against any noise issues from that space. Exiting the premises will solely be from HWK Bar's door entrance to the street. This will also mean that the door isn't constantly opening and closing allowing noise to escape, if there was no ingress and egress plan and guests could use the HWK bar door to enter and leave. This also ensures one way traffic throughout the whole venue.

The entrance and exit to each space will be manned by security: 1 at the coffee shop rear entrance (it's only access point on the night); one at the main entrance to the premises (the gated entrance with door in the gate) and 1 at HWK's door to the street, which will be opened by the security when people leave. All security will also be able to navigate guests to the toilet and smoking area, ensuring guests aren't going out on the street to loiter and smoke. Due to the courtyard this can all be contained and managed, further reducing the capability to disturb neighbours close by during the event.

It also must be pointed out, that in the event of an emergency, there are two doors on to the street (one from HWK Bar and one from the coffee shop) and the gated main entrance can be full opened and is 3 metres wide.

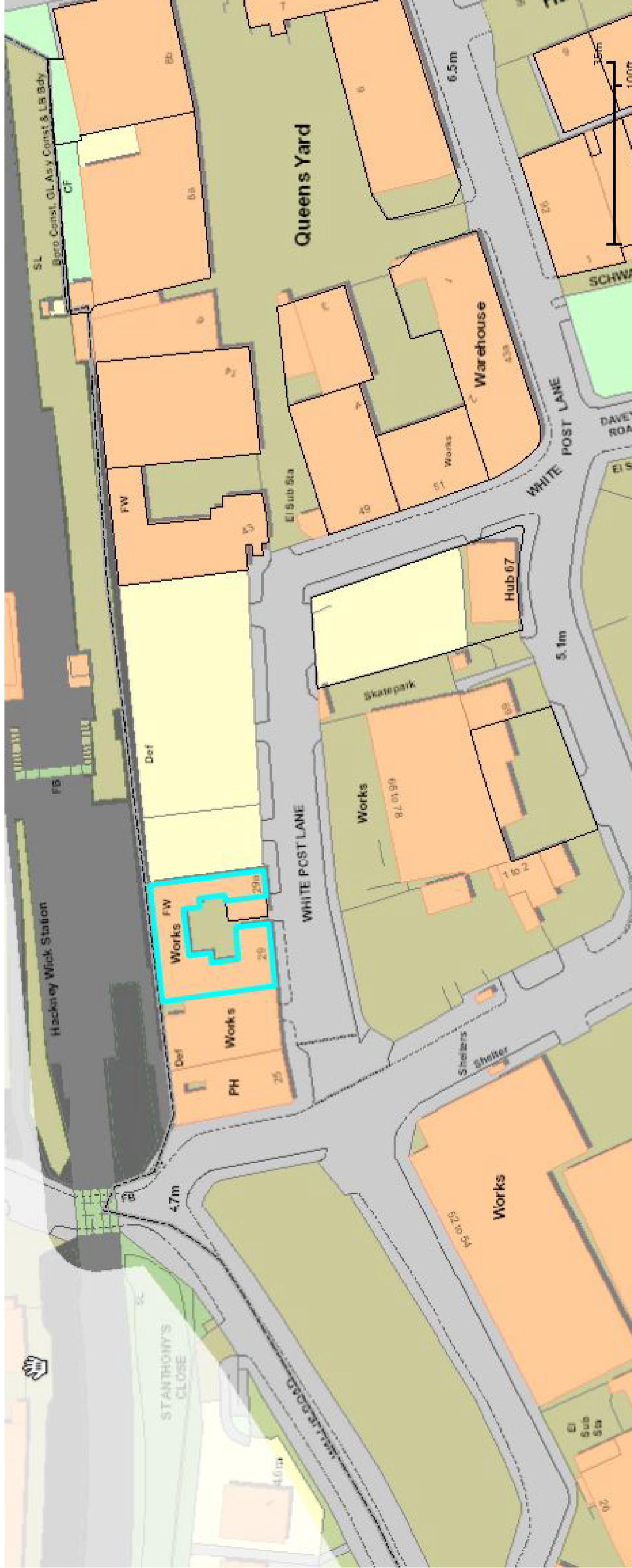

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

1.

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises;
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability)

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3.

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
4. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
5. 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula —

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
 where —
 - (i) **P** is the permitted price
 - (ii) **D** is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
 where —
 - (i) **P** is the permitted price
 - (ii) **D** is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the Tower Hamlets Police Licensing Team. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 30 days with date and time stamping. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 30 day period.
2. All staff responsible for selling alcohol shall receive regular training in the Licensing Act 2003 in terms of the licensing objectives, offences committed under the Act and conditions of the Premises Licence. Written records of this training shall be retained and made available to police and authorised officers of the Licensing Authority on request.

3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a) All crimes reported to the venue;
 - b) Any complaints received;
 - c) Any incidents of disorder;
 - e) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol;
 - h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
4. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
5. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance lobby or outside the premise building.
6. Refuse, including bottles are to be taken and placed into receptacles outside the premises at times which will minimise the disturbance to nearby premises. Refuse shall not be collected between the hours of 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours.
7. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
8. A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the premises by the police or an authorised officer at all times whilst the premises are open.
9. All windows and external doors shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access & egress of persons.
10. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 22:00 hours and 08:00 hours on the following day.
11. No deliveries to the premises shall take place between 22:00 hours and 08:00 hours the following day.

12. No external use of the courtyard area after 21:00 hours, except patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, which shall be limited to 8 persons, after 21:00 hours.

13. Access via the under passage shall be permitted until 23:30 hours.

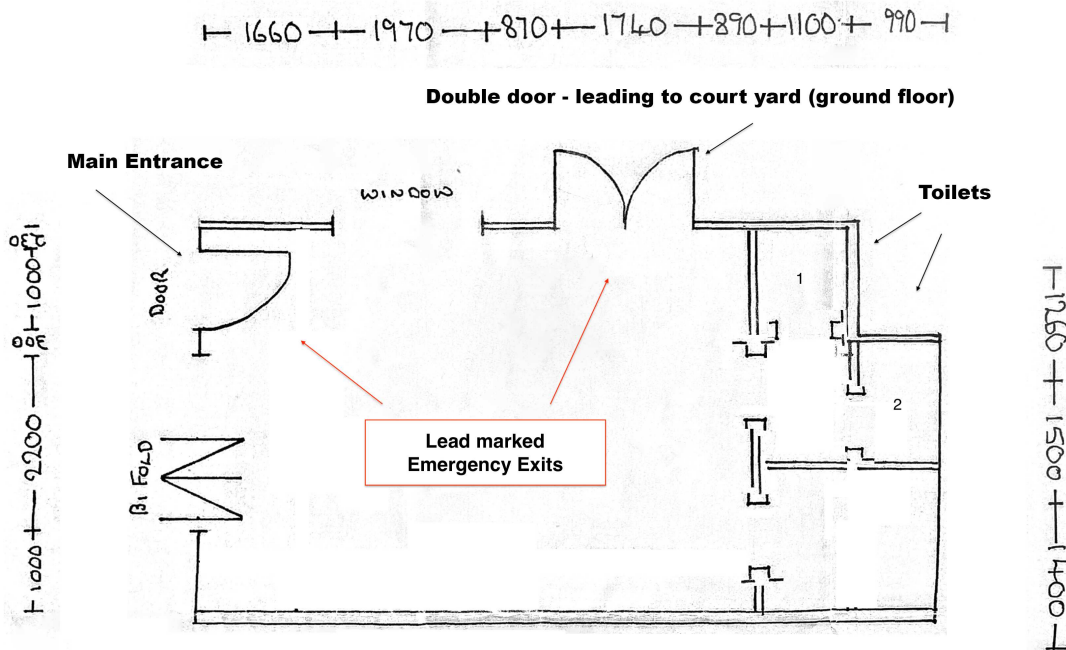

Dear Licensing,

I have considered the Temporary Event Notice (TENs) application for Hurk Limited Unit 8 29 White Post Lane and the potential impact of public nuisance and measures to prevent noise generated from within the premises or outside it which could cause disturbance to people in the vicinity.

The applicant is proposing the hours for their TENs application for the premises for licensable activities: sale of alcohol and the regulated entertainment on:

Saturday 2nd November 2019 until 02:00 hours (some two hours extension on current licence hours)

Sunday 3rd November 2019 until 04:00 hours (some five and a half hours extension on current licence hours)

Sensitive premises: Residential commercial premises in close proximity approximately 10 meters away.

In my view the TENs application, as it stands fails, to comply with the objective of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to “public nuisance” for the following reasons:-

- Noise breakout from the venue affecting neighbouring residents.
- Access & egress to and from the venue, of patrons, especially due to patrons likely to be in high spirits; and
- The hours of operation (inclusive of proposals)

CONCLUSION

Environmental Protection **does not** support the TENs application for Hurk Limited Unit 8 29 White Post Lane as there is greater likelihood of disturbance to residential premises at the noise sensitive hours sought.
