A search of the restaurant was conducted and it was thought a golf club was used in the original assault, which was not found - however items that may resemble a golf club were found and would be typical in any Bengali/Indian restaurant in which a Shahi Tandoor oven was used and accompanied with tandoori skewers, typically a stainless steel rod 65 cm long with a wooden handle - used to cook food on or pull out freshly cooked nan bread etc. Due to there being 15 or so of these items and them now being an obvious item in the kitchen they were not seized in evidence.

suspects was in a shop directly opposite Muhib Restaurant called A&Y Wines, 116, Brick Lane and I was aware that shortly afterwards A/PS MANNING arrested a male for Affray, I now know to be Monir MIAH, DOB 27/02/1972. I then assisted in a Section 32 PACE search of A&Y Wines and found behind the counter and hidden out of view a thick metal bar, approximately 14"-16" long, it had red rubber bands put around the base with sellotape above and below, which in my view had obviously been put on it to form a grip and therefore the iron bar had become a made or adapted weapon (photocopy attached). I seized this in evidence as exhibit BOR/1 and sealed it in an evidence bag D43815660. It was later booked into the property store book 105/7159.

I gave the item to A/PS MANNING who then further arrested Mr MIAH for being in Possession of an Offensive Weapon.

Mr MIAH was conveyed, via two home addresses he had given in which Section 18(5) PACE searches had been conducted.

At 22:26 hours I conducted a tape recorded interview at Limehouse Police Station, which concluded at 22:41 hours. I sealed the master tape as exhibit BOR/2 - seal D0141626V, booked into the property store book 105/2108. Completed at 11:45 hrs Sold Lucke 1(1914)

The Incident was still fresh in my mind when making this statement. No Other person present. On Wednesday 13th NOVEMBER 2013 I was on duty in full uniform in company with officers from the Borough Tasking Team B and Pc Brendan O'ROURKE 291HT. At approx 1730 hours I attended a briefing given by PC O'ROURKE on a section 8 search warrant that we would be executing at a restaurant named MUHIB in BRICK LANE E1. We were shown CCTV and slides of an incident that occurred in Brick Lane on September 8th 2013, where males were fighting in the street with weapons. We were informed that some of the individuals on the CCTV were believed to be restaurant owners and people that worked in Brick Lane. There was a significant male pointed out on the CCTV that was asian and approx F504 and was fat with a red tee shirt on This male had been seen with what was believed to be a golf club or similar object. This male was seen to attack other people involved in the incident. After the briefing we went to BRICK LANE police office and met with plain clothes officers. After a short while we went to the iocation and at approx 1935 hours we entered the property and conducted the search. After a short while I saw a male in the shop opposite who looked identical to the male in the CCTV who wore the red Tee shirt. I went across the road to the shop that was an off licence named A and Y off licence 116 Brick Lane. I approached the male and I informed him of what we were in the address opposite. I now know this man to be Monir MIAH 27/02/1972. He said "I don't know, no fighting." I then explained to him that I believed that he matched the description of a male that was seen in the street with a weapon on the 8th September 2013. He said "No". At 1955 hours I said to MIAH "Ok because you match the description of a male that was fighting in the street on the 8th


section 32 PACE search of the premises. This revealed that under the counter where he was stood there was an iron bar with a handle made from elastic bands adapted onto it. I said to him "What is this for. It appears to be a weapon." He replied "No it's not mine." I then said at 2005 "Ok your are further arrested for possession of an offensive weapon namely that adapted bar that is under the counter where you were stood." He made no further comment. We then went to his home address 59 CLEVLAND WAY E1 to search for the clothing used in the offence namely the RED Tee shirt. This was not found at the address. MIAH was then conveyed to HH custody. No handcuffs used for this arrest.
