### 3.0 **Background**

- 3.1 This is an application for a Standard Temporary Event Notice.
- 3.2 Enclosed is a copy of the application. (**See Appendix 1**).
- 3.3 The applicant has described the nature of the application as follows:

**The supply of alcohol  
Regulated Entertainment  
Late Night Refreshment**

- 3.4 The premises that has been applied for is:

**The Star of Bethnal Green  
359 Bethnal Green Road  
London E2 6LG**

A copy of the venue's premises licence is attached **as Appendix 2**.

- 3.5 The dates and times that have been applied for are as follows:  
**18<sup>th</sup> July, 2015, 02.00am – 03.00am**  
**19<sup>th</sup> July, 2015, 02.00am – 03.00am**
- 3.6 A map showing the relevant premises and immediate area is included as **Appendix 3**.

### 4.0 **Temporary Event Notices**

- 4.1 Temporary Event Notices (TENs) are a creation of the Licensing Act 2003. They provide a method by which licensable activities can be carried out on a temporary basis (max. 168 hrs) without a licence. The maximum number that can attend at any one time is 499. At least 10 full working days notice must be given to the licensing authority. When a TEN cannot be obtained, for example the event is over 499, then a full premises licence must be obtained, for a limited duration.
- 4.2 The licensing authority cannot oppose an application, (nor can local residents or businesses). The licensing authority must reject any application that does not meet the rules as to numbers, maximum per year etc. The limits are now as follows: 12 TEN per calendar year or 21 days. The responsible authorities that can object is the Metropolitan Police or Environmental Protection.
- 4.3 The Police and Environmental Protection can object on the grounds that allowing the event to go ahead will undermine one of the Licensing Objectives.

- 4.4 Following an objection by the relevant responsible authority one or more conditions may be imposed by the Licensing Authority
- (a) if it considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives to do so,
  - (b) the conditions are also imposed on a premises licence or club premises certificate that has effect in respect of the same premises, or any part of the same premises, as the temporary event notice, and
  - (c) the conditions would not be inconsistent with the carrying out of the licensable activities under the temporary event notice.
- 4.5 Where the authority decides to impose one or more conditions;
- (a) the authority must give the premises user notice of the decision;
  - (b) the notice must be accompanied by a separate statement (the “statement of conditions”) which sets out the conditions that have been imposed on the temporary event notice; and
  - (c) a copy of the notice and statement of conditions must be given to each relevant party.
- 4.6 LATE TENs have been created through the Police Reform and Social Responsibilities Act 2011, a Late TEN can be made no later than FIVE working days and no earlier than NINE working days before the event. The limits to these applications are no more than 2 for a non personal licence holder or no more than 10 for a personal licence holder.
- 4.7 The Police and Environmental Protection can object to Late TENs, if an objection is made the Licensing Authority must issue a counter notice advising the event cannot take place.

## 5.0 **Objections**

5.1 The Police objections are contained in **Appendix 4**.

## 6.0 **Advice to Members**

6.1 The Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011 have amended legislation whereby Environmental Protection alongside Police can object to Temporary Event Notice under any of the licensing objectives.

6.2 This hearing is required by the Licensing Act 2003. As always the decision is on the civil burden of proof, i.e. the balance of probability.

6.3 Members can consider any of the licensing objectives. Other matters can also be dealt with elsewhere by primary legislation.

6.4 Premises users are not required to be on the premises for the entire duration of the event authorised by the TEN, but they will remain liable to prosecution for certain offences that may be committed at the premises during the period covered by it. These include, for example, the offences of the sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk; persistently selling alcohol to children; and allowing disorderly conduct on licensed premises.

6.5 The police or local authority exercising environmental health functions may contact the premises user to discuss their objections and try to come to an agreement which will allow the proposed licensable activities to proceed. The TEN can be modified. If there is no agreement, the licensing authority must hold a hearing to consider the notice.

## **7.0 Legal Comments**

7.1 The Council's legal officer will give advice at the hearing.

### **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

1.

- (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of

alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on;
    - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
  3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

**Effective from 10<sup>th</sup> October 2010:**

- 4.

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that;

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—

- a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

## **2) On Sales**

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 10 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- c. On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- d. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.
- e. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11 a.m. to 11 p.m.
- f. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30 p.m.
- g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

Note: The premises may remain open for the twelve hours between 11pm on New Years Eve and 11am on New Years Day.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
  - (b) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
  - (c) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
  - (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
  - (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
  - (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
  - (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
  - (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
  - (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
  - (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
- Hot food and hot drinks may be sold for up to thirty minutes after the end of normal permitted hours.

#### **4) Off Sales**

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises  
Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;

Note: The premises may remain open for the twelve hours between 11pm on New Years Eve and 11am on New Years Day.

#### **5) Special Hours**

The following additional hours apply to the sale or supply of alcohol and regulated entertainment:

Sunday until midnight

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday until Midnight

Friday and Saturday until 02 00 hrs

A closing time of 02 00 hrs Monday to Thursday on no more than 20 five occasions. throughout the year, with a restriction of only one extension allowed in any one week. At least seven days notice is to be given to the local authority.

- (a) the permitted hours shall end at midnight . . . on any day on which music and dancing is not provided after midnight; and
- (b) on any day that music and dancing end between midnight and 02 00 hrs the permitted hours shall end when the music and dancing end

#### **6) Children in Bars**

No person under fourteen shall be in the bar of the licensed premises during the permitted hours unless one of the following applies:

- (1) He is the child of the holder of the premises licence.
- (2) He resides in the premises, but is not employed there.
- (3) He is in the bar solely for the purpose of passing to or from some part of the premises which is not a bar and to or from which there is no other convenient means of access or egress.
- (4) The bar is in railway refreshment rooms or other premises constructed, fitted and intended to be used bona fide for any purpose to which the holding of the licence is ancillary.

In this condition “bar” includes any place exclusively or mainly used for the consumption of intoxicating liquor. But an area is not a bar when it is usual for it to be, and it is, set apart for the service of table meals and alcohol is only sold or supplied to persons as an ancillary to their table meals.

#### **7) Regulated Entertainment**

The following activities are licensed:

Public MUSIC AND DANCING (INCLUDING ENTERTAINMENT OF THE LIKE KIND)

It is granted subject to the rules of the Council relating to the management of places of public entertainment and to the additional conditions as follows:

The inward opening doors to Rushmead shall be secured fully open at all times that the premises are occupied.

The doors into Bethnal Green Road shall be available for escape purposes at all times that the premises are occupied.

#### **8) Numbers present**

The maximum number of persons within the premises at any one time shall not exceed 150.

#### **9) Entry and Re-entry**

There shall be no entry or re-entry to the premises after midnight on Fridays or Saturdays.

#### **10) Noise Nuisance**

There shall be no noise nuisance caused to local residents.

#### **11) Licensed Area**

The licence is in respect of the Ground Floor and First floor only.

#### **12) Recorded Music and Private Entertainment**

The hours of recorded music only and private entertainment are not restricted

#### **13) Hot food and hot drinks**



Hot food and hot drinks may be sold for up to thirty minutes after the end of normal permitted hours

**14) Private Entertainment**

The premises may be used for the following purpose, that is to say, dancing, music, or other entertainment of the like kind which-

- a) is not a public entertainment but
- b) is promoted for private gain

**15) Public Entertainment**

Public Entertainment consisting of music and singing provided solely by the reproduction of recorded sound

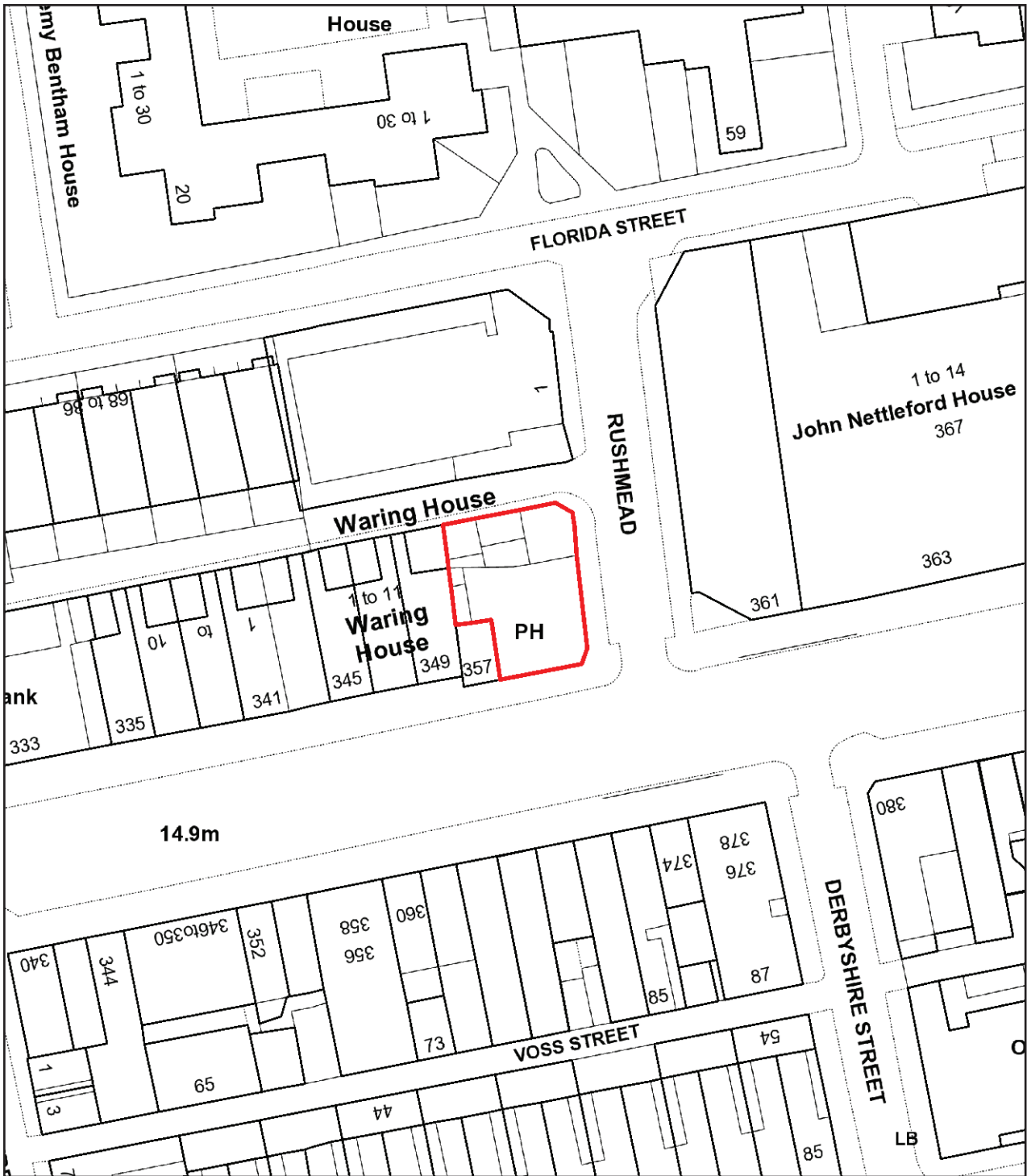

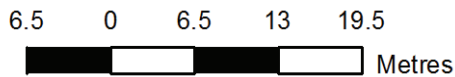

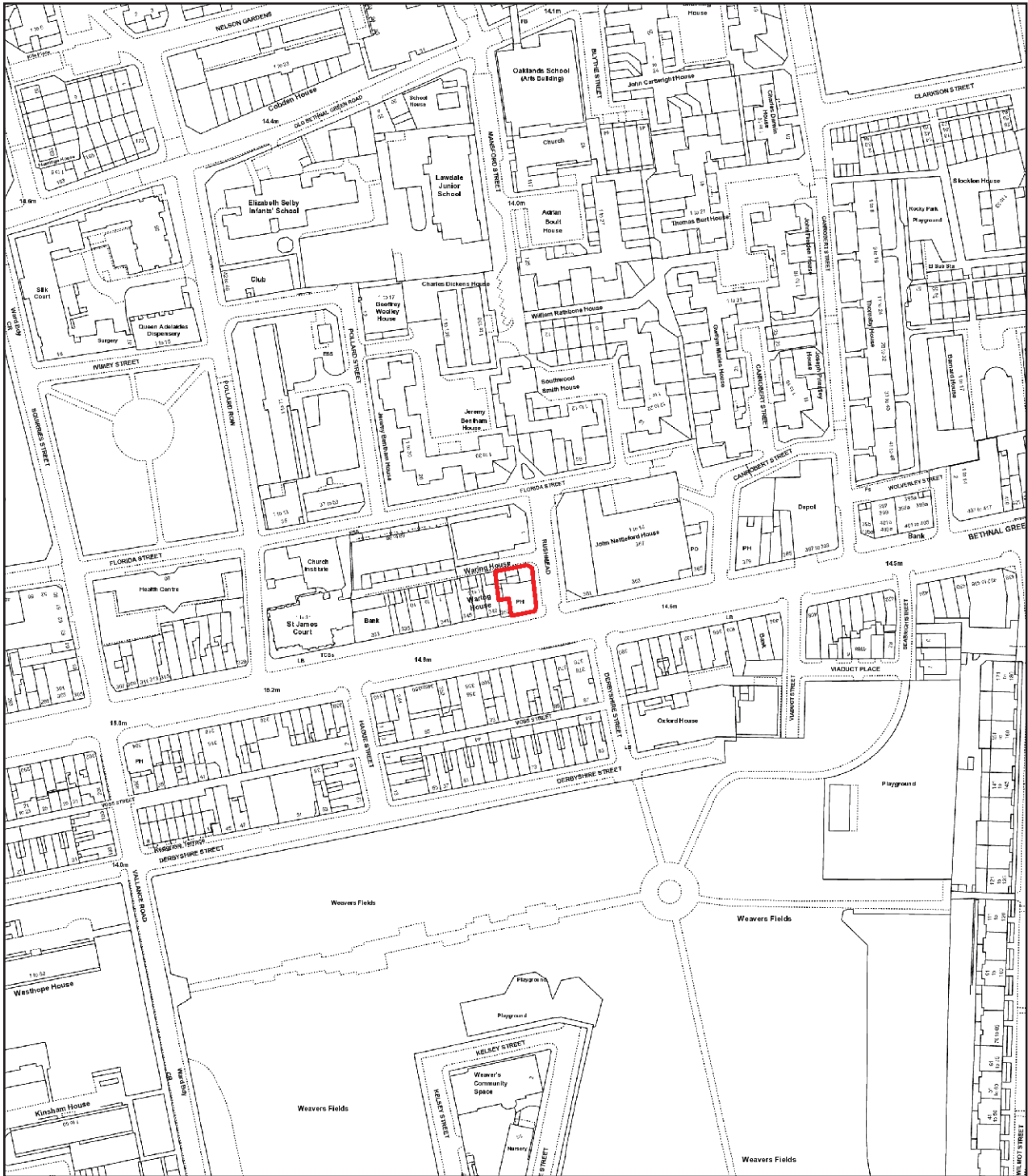

Police Licensing

Please accept this letter as notification that the police as a responsible authority wish to  
object to this application on the following licensing objective

**The prevention of crime and disorder, and public nuisance**

This application is for a Late Temporary Event Notice during the Lovebox Music Festival  
held in Victoria Park. This is an event that attracts up to 40,000 people to the Victoria  
Park and the surrounding area.

Many of the people leaving the event will have spent the day drinking alcohol, and will be  
intoxicated, and there is also drug use that at the festival.

Many of those leaving the Lovebox festival look to continue drinking in licensed premises in the area, or by transport links, or in areas that are known for having a vibrant night time economy.

If premises are open for extended hours this can lead to premises being swamped by people leaving the Lovebox festival as they often arrive in groups. This can lead to alcohol related violence and disorder taking place as they try to purchase drinks or loiter outside premises.

The Star of Bethnal Green is in walking distance of Victoria Park and is very close to the very busy area of Shoreditch, which may well be a destination for many of those leaving the event.

There is an extra risk associated with people leaving these events and going into licensed premises that are staying open later. Given that this application was only put in on Friday afternoon of the 3rd July and there is no accompanying additional security plan the risk level is higher as we have not had a chance to work with the applicant to work on security, or factor it into our policing plan. Tower Hamlets Police therefore ask that this application is rejected.
