Reasons for urgency

This report was delayed due to difficulty in pulling together relevant data from multiple sources during holiday period. It cannot wait until the next scheduled meeting as the Board are keen to move forward with issues around governance and make-up of the board and information on budgets and Mile End Park maintenance will both help inform this process. Additionally, the Charity annual returns have been late two years-running and an early sight and discussion of the 2018/19 accounts will help ensure measures are in place for an earlier annual meeting and clearance of accounts for submission to the Charity Commission.

Executive Summary

This is to provide updates on: budget, 10 year maintenance plan, proposal for new 5-a-side Astro pitches at Stepney Green and on summer activities

- 1. Note the final outturn budget for 2018-19.
- 2. Note the draft 10 year maintenance plan.
- 3. Note update for two new 5 a side Astro turf pitches at Stepney Green.
- 4. Note the 2019 summer activity programme.

1. REASONS FOR THE DECISIONS

- 1.1 The King Georges Fields charity is registered with the Charity Commission as King Georges Field, Mile End Charity, registered number 1077859.
- 1.2 The Council is the trustee of the charity and the council is the freehold owner of the land which is subject to this report.
- 1.3 The King Georges Fields Charity Board (the Board) is established by section 3.3.12 of the Council's Constitution, which gives the Board the following functions:
 - 3.2.1 To administer the affairs of the King Georges Fields Charity and discharge all the duties of the Council a sole trustee of the Charity
 - 3.2.2 To administer the affairs and discharge the duties of trustee of such other charities controlled by the Council as the Cabinet might authorise by resolution
- 1.4 The Board are asked to note the progress on developing two new five side pitches in Stepney Green.

2. <u>ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS</u>

2.1 There is no consideration for alternative options as no decisions are required on any of the items tabled, they are for noting only.

3. <u>DETAILS OF THE REPORT</u>

- 3.1 Appendix 1 details the figures for the end of financial year April 2018 to March 2019. Headline figure is a surplus of £273,399. These figures are subject to change and clarification but a healthy surplus will have been achieved within this year.
- 3.2 Appendix 2 is a draft of the 10 year maintenance plan for KGFT lands and infrastructure.
- 3.3 Appendix 3 is an assessment of how Stepney Green is currently used by the public and how this usage would be affected by the new pitches, it includes a drawing of the location and size.
- 3.4 Appendix 4 is an overview of the 2019 Parks summer programme.

4. **EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS**

4.1 Mile End Park is an important community asset that is open to all. As the population of the borough increases it, along with other parks, becomes increasingly important as a facility to support healthy living and community activity that helps promote community cohesion.

6. COMMENTS OF THE CHIEF FINANCE OFFICER

- 6.1 Appendix 1 details the KGFT accounts for the financial year 18/19 resulting in a surplus of £274k.
- 6.2 Appendix 2 provides an update on the 10 year maintenance plan. All maintenance costs will be covered within existing budgets and income targets.
- 6.3 Appendix 3 details the proposal for 2 new 5 a side football pitches in Stepney Green. The £200k cost of these pitches will be met by Film location income previously generated within Arts Parks and Events.
- 6.4 The funding for the 2 new pitches is available from filming holding account and not earmarked for any other projects.

7. COMMENTS OF LEGAL SERVICES

- 7.1 The Council is the Trustee of the Mile End Charity pursuant to the Governing Document which is a Scheme dated 28th February, 2000. The Council's Constitution establishes the King George's Fields Charity Board to administer the charities affairs and discharge the Council's trustee functions.
- 7.2 The purpose of the charity is to preserve the Park Lands in perpetuity as a memorial to King George V under the provisions of the King George's Fields Foundation. The 1965 Scheme which established the Foundation gave its purpose as "to promote and to assist in the establishment and to promote the preservation throughout the United Kingdom of Playing Fields for the use and enjoyment of the people..." Additionally, the trustees may "apply the land to such charitable purposes as are set out in the Recreational Charities Act 1958".
- 7.3 As trustees, the Board must make sure that the charity is carrying out the purposes for which it is set up, and no other purpose. Further, the Board

must act in the Charity's best interests and manage the Charity's resources responsibly.

7.4 This report provides information to the Board so that the trustees can undertake their duties. In considering this report and its recommendations, the Council must have due regard to the need to eliminate unlawful conduct under the Equality Act 2010, the need to advance equality of opportunity and the need to foster good relations between persons who share a protected characteristic and those who do not (the public sector equality duty). NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STAYEMENTS

For the year ended 31 March 2019

1. Accounting Policies

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with appropriate accounting standards. They follow the recommendations in the Statement of Recommended Practice-Accounting FRS 102 and Reporting by Charities issued in July 2014.
- b) All income is recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which it is receivable. Fees, charges and rents are accounted for as income as the date the Charity provides the relevant services and there is no entitlement to the funds.
- c) There are no restricted funds, within the definition contained in the SORP FRS 102. Incoming resources are therefore used for any of the Charity's purposes.
- d) Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended exclude VAT which is recoverable by the London Borough of Tower Hamlets.
- e) The Charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities
- f) Where income or expenditure has been recognised but cash has not been received or paid, a debtor or creditor for the relevant amount is recorded in the balance sheet.
- g) Employees working in the Mile End Park and at other local parks and open spaces are Council Employees. They are eligible to join the Local Government Pension Scheme administered by the London Borough of Tower Hamlets.
- h) The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis on the assumption that the Charity will continue to receive adequate support from Tower Hamlets Council.

Appendix 3 - Stepney Green Park, proposed 5 a-side Astro Pitches

Current use of Stepney Green Park

- Sports and recreation with formal football use on central grass and 3G pitch (both bookable)
- The location is very popular by local schools for sports and general play, particularly during summer period for sports days and large recreation activities (used regularly by Stepney Green, Sir John Cass, Redcoat, and Bishop Challoner schools)
- Separate toddler and junior playgrounds very popular and regularly used by locals
- Walk through, picnic, soft recreation, family spot overlooking the playground
- Popular with dog use, in particular within the fenced dog use area
- Community events
- Jogging
- Picnics

Description of proposed location:

- Grassed/turfed mound area, highest natural point in the park
- 2 mature trees
- West of proposed site comprises of perennial bedding of different species, and just north of the location comprises a stretch of informal hedge
- Proposed location estimate: 140 160 square metres, and rectangular shaped
- An informal pathway allows visitors to cut through to the playground or southern exit

Current use of proposed location:

- Thoroughfare into the playground, and south exit / entrance
- Picnic is very popular in particular beneath the 2 mature trees for shade
- Soft recreation and informal gatherings / chilling out
- Sight line into the playground is extremely good, which is beneficial for parents to relax whilst having a good view into the playground
- Visibility into the astro turf for spectators, in particular for pitch 1 and 2 (west of astro turf)

Impact of proposed 5 a side astro

- Removal informal route through from the main path to the playground and park exit
- Removal of 2 trees and shrubs
- Possible removal or reduction of perennial bedding (located on west of proposed location)
- Removal of a green space/ picnic area used by parents and children within close proximity of playground

- Potential noise from astro football use into the playground, in particular the toddlers play space which is the nearest.

Mitigation of impact of proposed 5 a side astro

- Planting additional trees and shrubs
- Create new perennial bedding area
- Create new picnic area adjacent to the playgrounds

Benefits of 5 a side astro

- Infrastructure and management already in place from the existing astro turf such as changing rooms, services, maintenance plan, security cover and supervision already on site
- Demand for astro usage in the borough, including demand for 5 a side pitches
- Additional income to offset running costs
- Promoting the borough's Healthy Living and Staying Fit initiative by providing additional sports space
- 5 a side pitch will cater for smaller groups. Currently 7 a side is the smallest astro space available at Stepney Green

Additional information

The site achieved its first Green Flag status in 2018, and had a playground renovation in 2019.
