<u>DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS AT MEETINGS- NOTE FROM THE</u> MONITORING OFFICER

This note is for guidance only. For further details please consult the Code of Conduct for Members at Part C. Section 31 of the Council's Constitution

(i) Disclosable Pecuniary Interests (DPI)

You have a DPI in any item of business on the agenda where it relates to the categories listed in **Appendix A** to this guidance. Please note that a DPI includes: (i) Your own relevant interests; (ii)Those of your spouse or civil partner; (iii) A person with whom the Member is living as husband/wife/civil partners. Other individuals, e.g. Children, siblings and flatmates do not need to be considered. Failure to disclose or register a DPI (within 28 days) is a criminal offence.

Members with a DPI, (unless granted a dispensation) must not seek to improperly influence the decision, must declare the nature of the interest and leave the meeting room (including the public gallery) during the consideration and decision on the item – unless exercising their right to address the Committee.

DPI Dispensations and Sensitive Interests. In certain circumstances, Members may make a request to the Monitoring Officer for a dispensation or for an interest to be treated as sensitive.

(ii) Non - DPI Interests that the Council has decided should be registered – (Non - DPIs)

You will have 'Non DPI Interest' in any item on the agenda, where it relates to (i) the offer of gifts or hospitality, (with an estimated value of at least £25) (ii) Council Appointments or nominations to bodies (iii) Membership of any body exercising a function of a public nature, a charitable purpose or aimed at influencing public opinion.

Members must declare the nature of the interest, but may stay in the meeting room and participate in the consideration of the matter and vote on it **unless**:

• A reasonable person would think that your interest is so significant that it would be likely to impair your judgement of the public interest. If so, you must withdraw and take no part in the consideration or discussion of the matter.

(iii) Declarations of Interests not included in the Register of Members' Interest.

Occasions may arise where a matter under consideration would, or would be likely to, affect the wellbeing of you, your family, or close associate(s) more than it would anyone else living in the local area but which is not required to be included in the Register of Members' Interests. In such matters, Members must consider the information set out in paragraph (ii) above regarding Non DPI - interests and apply the test, set out in this paragraph.

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 The Licensing Committee is recommended to consider the application and objection and then adjudicate accordingly.

3. **DETAILS OF THE REPORT**

This is an application made by Culian Fu for a Special Treatment Licence for 3.1 Lily Thai Spa, 1 Whites Row, London E1 7NF. The application states the treatments to be provided would Massage and Manicure. The application form and supporting documents supplied by applicant can be found in Appendix 1.

- 3.2 A licence from the Council is required for the use of a premises as an establishment for special treatments. An establishment for special treatment is defined in the Act as any premises in the borough used, intended to be used or represented as being used for the reception or treatment of persons requiring massage, manicure, acupuncture, tattooing, cosmetic piercing, chiropody, light, electric or other special treatment of a like kind or vapour, sauna or other baths.
- 3.3 The application has been consulted on in accordance with the London Local Authorities Act 1991 and Tower Hamlets Regulations made under 10(1) of the Act.

This included:

- a) A notice at the premises displayed by the applicant during the required period.
- b) A Public Newspaper Notice placed in The East London Advertiser on 3rd August 2023 by the applicant. This has can be found at **Appendix 2**.
- c) The application being sent to the Police and London Fire Brigade on 26th July 2023.

Objection

- 3.4 James Doherty Health and Safety Officer, Licensing and Safety Team has objected to the granting of this application. This objection has already been made available to the applicant. The objection is due to the following reasons, and can be found in **Appendix 3**:
 - The premises has a history of being improperly conducted because it has previously been found offering services of a sexual nature. This has resulted in Council revoking a previous licence on 14th July 2022, and refusing an application for a new special treatment licence on 4th October 2022. Appendix 4 & 5
 - The current applicant is linked to the previous refused application and revoked Licence, in respect of being a Director of Redbud London Ltd since 6th April 2022. The company's registered address is 1 Whites Row. Appendix 6
 - Premises found appearing to provide special treatments without a licence (during application consultation period).

4. Legislative provisions

- 4.1 Licences are granted subject to standard conditions.
- 4.2 Those Standard Conditions of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets were made under the London Local Authorities Act 1991, Section 10(1). It is the duty of any licence holder to be aware of and abide by those conditions. A copy of the standard conditions is exhibited as **Appendix 7**.

- 4.3 Under section 8 of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 the Council may refuse to grant a licence on the following grounds:
 - (a) the premises are not structurally suitable for the purpose;
 - (b) there is a likelihood of nuisance being caused by reason of the conduct, management or situation of the premises or the character of the relevant locality or the use to which any premises in the vicinity are put;
 - (c) the persons concerned or intended to be concerned in the conduct or management of the premises used for special treatment could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper persons to hold such a license;
 - (d) the persons giving the special treatment are not suitably qualified;
 - (e) the premises have been or are being improperly conducted;
 - (f) the premises are not provided with satisfactory means of lighting, sanitation and ventilation;
 - (g) the means of heating the premises are not safe;
 - (h) proper precautions against fire on the premises are not being taken;
 - (i) they are not satisfied as to the safety of equipment used in the special treatment or as to the manner in which the treatment is to be given;
 - (j) they are not satisfied as to the safety of the special treatment to be given;
 - (k) satisfactory means of escape in case of fire and suitable means for fighting fire are not provided on the premises;
 - (I) the applicant has, within the period of five years immediately preceding the application to the borough council, been convicted of an offence under this Part of this Act.

5. **EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS**

7.1 There are no equalities implications.

8. OTHER STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

- 8.1 Best Value implications: There are no best value implications.
- 8.2 Environmental considerations: There are no environmental implications.
- 8.3 Crime reduction: One of the key licensing objectives of the Council is to ensure that it does not licence premises that are liable to be a source of crime and disorder. The Council supports and assists with crime and disorder reduction

- by controlling those who manage premises open to members of the public and imposing conditions on relevant premises licences. Illegal activity has been proven to occur at the premises.
- 8.4 Safeguarding: There are no proven safeguarding impacts; however, premises that are managed in this way may employ underage persons or vulnerable adults. Therefore, there may be a positive safeguarding impact.
- 8.5 Risk Management: The Council will be at risk of legal challenge if its processes are not transparent and evidentially based.

9. COMMENTS OF THE CHIEF FINANCE OFFICER

9.1 There are no material financial implications arising from the recommendation. If the special treatment licence is not granted, the council will forego the license income and this will be managed within existing budget provision.

10. COMMENTS OF LEGAL SERVICES

- 10.1 Section 6 of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 ("the Act) requires that any premises to be used for special treatments is licensed ("a special treatment licence") by the Council. Special treatment covers a wide range of activities including body piercing, tattooing, acupuncture, massage, manicure and sauna.
- 10.2 The application process for a special treatment licence is not prescribed in statute and may be (but need not be) the subject of regulations made by the Authority under s.7(4) of the Act. The application must be sent to the Commissioner of Police and to the London Fire Brigade, both of whom may object within 28 days. The Act expressly allows for late representations to be considered, at the Authority's discretion. Any other person may nonetheless object to the application.
- 10.3 As set out in paragraph 4 above, there are a number of statutory reasons upon which the Authority may refuse to grant a special treatment licence. These reasons include that:
 - the persons concerned or intended to be concerned in the management of the premises could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper persons to hold such a licence (s.8(c));
 - the premises have been or are being improperly conducted (s.8(e));
 - the applicant has, within the five years immediately preceding the application, been convicted of an offence under Part II of the Act (s.8(I)).
- 10.4 S.10 gives an Authority power to make regulations providing for standard conditions that will be deemed to apply to all licences granted under the Act, unless expressly amended or excluded. This power is in addition to the general power to impose appropriate conditions to individual licences under s.6.
- 11.5 Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010 requires the authority, in the exercise of its functions, to have due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination,

harassment, victimisation and any other conduct prohibited by the 2010 Act, to advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and those who do not, and to foster good relations between those who share a relevant protected characteristic and those who do not. The relevant protected characteristics are age; disability gender reassignment; pregnancy and maternity; race; religion or belief; sex; sexual orientation. Members are required to have regards to the Act when making their decision.

The Licensing and Safety team of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets is making a representation objecting to the above application based on the following grounds:

Under Section 8 (c) and (e) of the above Act

(c) persons concerned or intended to be concerned in the conduct or management of the premises used for special treatment could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper persons to hold such a license; (e)the premises have been or are being improperly conducted.

The reason for the objection is that the premises has a history of offering services of a sexual nature. A previous licence for this premises was revoked by the Licensing Committee on the 14th July 2022 and that licence holder, Culian Fu, is now and was listed as a company director of Redbud London Ltd at Companies House on the latest application – see Appendix 5 Companies House Entry

Appendix 6 Revocation Minutes of 14th July 2022

Redbud London Ltd again applied for the special treatments license at the same address under the director Culian Fu but this was refused on the 4th October 2022 by the Licensing Committee on the grounds that the premises has an established history of offering sexual services – See Appendix 7

On the 23rd March 2019, Redbud (London) Ltd was convicted at Thames Magistrates Court of an offence under the London Local Authorities Act 1991 Section 14(2). This was due to the offering of services of a sexual nature was in breach of its special treatment licence condition.

One of the key licensing objectives of the Council is to ensure that it does not licence premises that might be a source of crime and disorder. The Council supports and assists with crime and disorder reduction by controlling those who manage premises open to members of the public and imposing conditions on relevant premises licences. Illegal activity has been proven to occur at the premises and the Licensing and Safety Team of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets are of the belief that the premises a likelihood of continuation and nuisance being

caused by reason of the conduct or management of the premises given all past and proven history of offering sexual services.

I visited the premises at 1 Whites Row E1 7NF on Mon 11th September at 15.00 and witnessed the shop to be open and offering massage.

The venue has 4 treatment rooms and one of these was closed, a member of staff confirmed that a person was receiving a massage.

Minutes:

At the request of the Chair, Mr Amran Ali, Health & Safety Officer Environmental Health Officer, introduced the report seeking a revocation of the special treatment licence for Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 Whites Row, London E1 7NF. He explained that the Committee is recommended to consider revocation of the licence on the basis that the business was found to be offering services of a sexual nature. It was noted on 15th & 29th October 2021 test purchases were carried out by professional surveillance company and found that services of a sexual nature was being offered by the therapist and the statement of the test purchaser can be found on page 180 of the agenda.

Mr Ali pointed out that when businesses are selected for the test purchasing exercise the Council appoints a professional surveillance company and provides a list of the premises to the company and that it was the surveillance company that appoint individuals to go to the premises at their own time within a time period to conduct the visit and there is no information provided to the Council Officers beforehand as to which premises they're going to and on what day. It was also noted that a follow up compliance visit was carried out on the 27th January 2021 by Officers from the Council, two massage therapists were present at the premises one of whom was not listed as a therapist nor any qualifications certificates were provided and this was a breach of condition 6 of the standard conditions.

Mr Ali informed the Committee that Ms Cheung Lai Kwan's (Premise Licence Holder) Legal Representative had been in contact with him and had informed him that his client had been in Hong Kong since December 2009 and a copy of the e-mail can be seen on page 7 of the supplemental agenda pack. In the e-mail the solicitor representing the licensee stated that she was in December since 2019 and currently still in Hong Kong, he also stated that following the findings of the test purchases she had decided to sell the business and the business was sold on the 11th of April 2022. The Legal Representative since then had sent another email today to confirm that the licensee now wishes for her licence to be cancelled. Mr Ali explained that there was insufficient time to process that request hence why this report has been brought to the Committee with a recommendation to revoke the licence.

Mr Ali concluded that such sexual services do resemble services of prostitution and can often be linked with other criminal activities such as human trafficking, exploitation of vulnerable females, and money laundering, as well as giving rise to an increased risk of spreading infectious diseases. These activities risked tarnishing the reputation of Tower Hamlets.

There were no questions from Members.

There were no other interested parties present to make a representation. Therefore the Chair announced that the Committee would deliberate after the meeting and the decision would be sent out in writing.

DECISION

The Licensing Committee considered an application by the Licensing and Safety Team seeking the revocation of the special treatment licence held by Cheung Lai Kwan in respect of Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 White's Row, London, E1 ("the Premises"). The basis of the application was that two test purchases carried out in October 2021 had resulted in sexual services being offered by therapists.

The Committee was also aware of correspondence between the Licensing and Safety Team and the licence holder's solicitor which stated, among other things, that Ms. Kwan had sold the business, that she had been in Hong Kong since December 2019, that she was not intending to return to the UK in the foreseeable future, and that she has no further interest in the business. The Committee was advised that this did not meet the requirements of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 for a formal request to cancel.

The Committee heard from Mr. Ali, who outlined the test purchases and the reasons why revocation was sought. The Premises were being improperly conducted, the activity alleged was tantamount to prostitution, such offences were often linked to other criminal activity, and the perpetuation of these activities tarnished the Borough's reputation.

The licence holder did not attend. The Committee noted the correspondence submitted on her behalf.

The Committee was satisfied as to the evidence of the test purchasers, which was in the agenda packs and which amounted to a breach of conditions 7B and 9 of the Council's standard conditions which apply to all special treatment licences. In the absence of any representations from the licence holder (and noting in any event that she appears to no longer be involved in the business) and given her long absence during which she cannot have been exercising proper control, the Committee was satisfied that it was appropriate to revoke the licence on the basis of section 8(c) and 8(e) of the London Local Authorities Act, namely that the persons concerned in the conduct or management of the premises could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper to hold such a licence, and that the premises have been or are being improperly conducted.

Accordingly, the Committee unanimously;

RESOLVED

That the **Revocation** of the special treatment licence for Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 White's Row, London, E1 7NF be **GRANTED.**

Hearing to consider refusal to grant a special treatment licence for Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 Whites Row, London E1 7NF

Meeting of Licensing Committee, Tuesday, 4th October, 2022 6.30 p.m. (Item 2.1)

Minutes:

At the request of the Chair, Mr Kamal Miah, Environmental Health Officer, introduced the report which was seeking a refusal to grant a special treatment licence for Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 Whites Row, London E1 7NF. He explained the reason for the objection and gave a brief history of the premises.

It was noted that Redbud (London) Ltd previously held a special treatment licence which was granted on 23rd March 2016 and renewed annually until 14th March 2019 when its renewal application was refused by Licensing Committee for offering services of a sexual nature. Then on the 23rd March 2019, Redbud (London) Ltd was convicted at Thames Magistrates Court of an offence under the London Local Authorities Act 1991 Section 14(2). This was due to the offering of services of a sexual nature in breach of its special treatment licence conditions.

It was further noted that on the 16th October and 29th October 2021, test purchases were carried out by a professional surveillance company and found services of a sexual nature were being offered during the massage treatment on both occasions. Ms. Kwan was the licence holder at this time. Ms Cheung Lai Kwan's special treatment licence was revoked by Licensing Committee on the 14th July 2022. She was a listed as a director of Redbud (London) Ltd at the time of the test purchases.

Mr Miah also highlighted that the two massage therapists listed in the new application made by Redbud (London) Ltd are the same therapists listed under the previous licence held by Ms Kwan at the test purchases. For these reasons, the Licensing and Safety Team had concerns that the premises has been operated improperly. Furthermore, the proposed licence holder, Redbud (London) Ltd, cannot reasonably be regarded as fit and proper to hold a special treatment licence given the previous recent conviction for breaches of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 for similar issues that occurred in October 2021.

Members then heard from Mr Robert Sutherland representing the Applicant Ms Cui Lan Fu. He stated that nothing said by Mr Miah was being disputed. He referred to the supporting documents submitted which set out the statements setting out the circumstances for which the application had been applied for. He explained that the applicant had acquired the company name in order to take over the premises and in turn change company ownership. He explained that the applicant has had no history with the premises, no history with the previous operation of the business or the previous operators under Redbud London Ltd.

Mr Sutherland acknowledged the fact that there may be concerns in relation to this particular Applicant because of the history of the premises and therefore asked the Committee to consider granting a licence for a short period of three months to enable Ms Fu to make an application to transfer that licence into her own personal name or into another company formally separating herself from Redbud Ltd. This would also enable officers to consider Ms Fu's application in view of her experience and good record she operates in her other premises.

Mr Sutherland assured the committee that Ms Fu would seek to operate at this particular premises with high standards and ensure that allegations to which Mr Miah refers to doesn't happen again. Ms Fu intends to put in rigorous checks and balances to ensure this doesn't happen again. As well as this a detailed document has been drafted which sets out the requirements that expects from her therapists with regards to their experience and also a declaration that makes it very clear that they can't be offering and shouldn't be offering any sexual services. The document also gets therapists to confirm that they have not been arrested or convicted or charged or investigated in any acts in relation to prostitution or offering any services of sexual services. This was in hope that any therapist would be discouraged from doing such acts if it's in the form of a contract that they're going to enter into.

Mr Sutherland also highlighted the fact that the premises will display signage around the premises making it clear that if a customer is offered sexual services and if it is reported then the money for the service initially provided would be refunded. This would be addressing the problem directly and making it clear that such activity would not be tolerated at the premises. It was also noted that Ms Fu would also look to appointing her own mystery shopper which again will provide some checks and balances to ensure the quality of services are maintained but also sexual services are not being offered without her knowledge.

Mr Sutherland concluded by urging Members to grant the licence for up to three months in order for the licence to be transferred into Ms Fu's name or into another acceptable company name and within that space of time she will be able to re-establish the operation of the premises.

In response to questions, it was noted;

- That the applicant was not involved or aware of any wrong doings at the premises before taking over the premises.
- The applicant was only made aware of the allegations when objections were raised by Council Officers and she was contacted by Democratic Services for the hearing.
- Mr. Miah was asked why it had taken until now before these allegations were brought to Ms. Fu's attention. He explained that the service had a number of cases to investigate, not just this one, and those took time. Evidence needed to be obtained and lines of enquiry pursued and it took a considerable period of time to be able to put cases together for either Committee or for referring to Legal Services. He confirmed that the case had been brought to the Committee within an appropriate time frame.

At this juncture, Mr Jonathan Melnick, Legal Advisor to the Committee, pointed out that Councillor Rebekha Sulthana had left the meeting for a short while during the submissions for this application and she was therefore advised that she could not

participate in the decision making for this particular application during deliberations. However, she could remain and participate for the rest of the meeting.

Concluding remarks were made by both parties.

Decision

The Licensing Committee considered an objection to an application by Redbud (London) Ltd. for a new special treatment licence (MST licence) in respect of Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 White's Row, London, E1 ("the Premises"). The application had been objected by the Licensing Authority on the basis that there was a history of sexual services having been offered by therapists at the Premises.

Kamal Miah, on behalf of the Licensing Authority, explained his objection. The company had previously held an MST licence from March 2016 until March 2019. In March 2019 the company and its then-director were convicted of offences under s.14 of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 for breaches of licence conditions, which included therapists offering sexual services. A renewal application had been refused in March 2019.

An MST licence had subsequently been issued to Cheung Lai Kwan. On 16th and 29th October 2021, test purchases were carried out at the Premises. On both occasions the therapist carrying out the massage had offered the test purchaser sexual services. Ms. Kwan was at this time the director of Redbud (London) Ltd. The licence was subsequently revoked at a Licensing Committee hearing on 14th July 2022. Given the history, he was of the view that the Premises had been or were improperly conducted, that the applicant could reasonably be regarded as not fit and proper to hold a licence, and that the applicant had been convicted of an offence under the 1991 Act in the five years immediately preceding the application.

Robert Sutherland addressed the Committee on behalf of Ms. Fu, the sole director of the company. There was no dispute as to the history. The reason the application had been made in the company name was that the company held the lease. Ms. Fu had taken over the company in April 2022 and she had done so for administrative convenience, since it would mean that the lease of the Premises did not need to change hands. She had no history with the Premises or the previous operators.

Although the company was the same, its controlling mind was not. He submitted that if the Committee had a concern then one option was to grant the licence for a short period of time, perhaps three months, to allow the authority to be satisfied as to compliance and also to allow for the licence to be transferred to Ms. Fu personally or into another company name. The Committee was told that she operated other premises without incident.

The Premises offered to change its name to Bamboo Thai, to dispel any association with the former operators. The therapists previously working at the Premises would not be employed and she would place signage to make clear that sexual services would not be on offer.

Despite the apparent change in ownership, the Committee's concerns were not assuaged. There was a history of sexual services at the Premises, as evidenced by test purchases. To date, the premises had been licensed to two entities; the company and to Ms. Kwan. Sexual services had been offered while under the management of both. Ms. Kwan was not a director of the company at the time of the first test purchase, having been appointed as director in December 2019. Given that one change in ownership or management had apparently not changed matters, the Committee was unable to give any real weight to Ms. Fu's assurances that she would not operate in the same way.

It also appeared to the Committee that Ms. Fu had not carried out sufficient due diligence before taking over the company. Had she done so, it might be that she would have been aware of the history and would not have taken over the Premises.

The Committee also considered there to be a risk of previous clients returning to the Premises in order to obtain sexual services.

There was no dispute that the company had been convicted of a criminal offence in March 2019. The Committee considered the suggestions of signage and a shorter period. The former gave no comfort since the offer of sexual services was already prohibited by standard conditions; the latter was not appropriate because it would not address the concerns of the previous history and it would not be a realistically long period in which to assess compliance. A longer period was considered but that imposed a burden on the Authority to monitor compliance. Ultimately, nothing that the Committee had heard gave it sufficient confidence that the Premises would be operated in strict compliance with the conditions having regard to the history.

The Committee was therefore satisfied that it was appropriate to refuse the application on the basis of section 8(c), 8(e), and 8(l), of the London Local Authorities Act 1991, namely that the persons concerned in the conduct or management of the premises could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper to hold such a licence, that the premises have been or are being improperly conducted, and that the applicant has within five years immediately preceding the application been convicted of an offence under the London Local Authorities Act 1991.

Accordingly, the Committee made a majority decision;

MASSAGE AND SPECIAL TREATMENT LICENCE CONDITIONS

The COUNCIL of the LONDON BOROUGH OF TOWER HAMLETS, under the provisions of LONDON LOCAL AUTHORITIES ACT 1991, hereby authorise the person(s) or company named in the schedule to carry on, up to and including an establishment for the giving of massage or special treatment specified in the schedule at the address and in the trade name or style or title so specified subject to the following conditions:-

- 1. The establishment shall be carried on only for the treatment or business and in the trade name or style or title specified in this licence and at the address mentioned herein.
- All notices and advertisements issued by or on behalf of the establishment 2. shall bear the trade name or style or title aforesaid and the name of individual assistants shall not be given in such notices and advertisements.
- 3. The licensee shall at once notify the Council in writing addressed to the Environmental Health Commercial Team Manager, 4th Floor Tower Hamlets Town Hall 160 Whitechapel Road London E1 1BJ, of any change in the name or private address of the licensee or in the treatment afforded or the nature of the business carried on at the establishment.
- 4. Except with the written consent of the Council, the licensee shall not employ in the conduct of the establishment any person (a) whose licence has been revoked or to whom a licence has been refused on the ground that such person is unsuitable to hold a licence to carry on an establishment for massage or special treatment, or (b) who is unsuitable to be so employed on the ground that misconduct in connection with the employment of such person in an establishment for massage or special treatment has been proved to the satisfaction of the Council; and, except with such consent, the licensee shall not allow or permit any such person to be directly or indirectly interested in the business carried on at the establishment.
- 5. The licensee, if a company within the meaning of the companies Act, 1948, or any Act amending the same shall forthwith notify the Council in writing of any change in the constitution of the directorate of such company during the currency of this licence
- All treatments shall be given only by persons approved by the Council or, 6. provided that the written consent of the Council has been obtained, under the personal supervision of a person approved by the Council.
- 7. The following treatments shall, unless the consent of the Council in writing has otherwise been obtained, only be permitted by a qualified physiotherapist in accordance with the directions of a registered medical practitioner with specific reference to the client to whom the treatment is to be given:-Massage for curative purposes, long and short wave diathermy; ultra-sonic treatments; treatment of moles, ultra-violet ray treatment and electro-sleep therapy
- 8. No instrument, apparatus or equipment shall be used in the establishment without the prior written consent of the Council.

- 9. The licensee shall at all times take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of their clients when on the establishment.
- 10. The Licensee shall ensure that with exception of those persons receiving treatment in accordance with the conditions of this licence all clients present in any part of the establishment shall be decently and properly attired and separate changing accommodation for males and females shall be provided.
- 11. (i) The walls and ceilings of any treatment room or waiting room shall be maintained in a sound structural and clean condition and the surfaces shall be such as to facilitate easy cleansing.
 - (ii) There shall be provided in every treatment room suitable floor covering which shall be such as to facilitate easy cleansing.
 - (iii) There shall be adequate light and ventilation to any treatment or waiting room either by natural of artificial means.
 - (iv) There shall be provided in every treatment room a suitable wash-hand basin or basins provided with an adequate supply of hot and cold water.
 - (v) There shall be provided, in respect of a wash-hand basin, soap, a nailbrush and a supply of disposable towels or a clean towel available at all times.
 - (vi) There shall be provided in every treatment and waiting room suitable and sufficient means for heating and a reasonable room temperature shall be maintained.
 - (vii) Where it is intended that more than one person shall be treated in a room, suitable screening shall be provided to maintain privacy.
 - (viii) There shall be provided in respect of every establishment sanitary accommodation to the standard laid down in regulations made under the relevant registration such sanitary accommodation to be available to and readily accessible for clients.
 - (ix) There shall be provided proper means for securing the cleanliness of all instruments, towels and materials and equipment used in connection with the establishment.

Further condition to be included in appropriate cases:-

12. Unless otherwise expressly permitted by the Council when treatment is given or is being received to any part of the body other than the neck and head or feet and legs below the knee or hands and arms and is not being so given by a fully qualified physiotherapist of other person entered on the register of the appropriate professional organisation whose qualifications have been approved by the Council, the treatment may be given only to persons of the same sex as the person giving the treatment and persons of the opposite sex shall not be present.

<u>N.B</u>.

- (I) The licence is not transferable either as regards the person to whom, to the premises in respect of which, it is granted.
- (II) The licensees shall on application for renewal of their licence submit to the Council a certificate signed by a competent electrician certifying the safety of all electrical equipment and apparatus used within the terms of the licence.

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 The Licensing Committee is recommended to consider the request to refuse the grant of the special treatment licence and then adjudicate accordingly.

3. DETAILS OF THE REPORT

3.1 This is a report by the Licensing and Safety Team to object to the application for the grant of a new special treatment licence for Thai Garden Massage Therapy, 35 Artillery Lane, London E1 7LP. The application states the treatments to be provided is Massages. The application form and supporting documents supplied by applicant can be found in **Appendix 1**.

- 3.2 A licence from the Council is required for the use of a premises as an establishment for special treatments. An establishment for special treatment is defined in the Act as any premises in the borough used, intended to be used or represented as being used for the reception or treatment of persons requiring massage, manicure, acupuncture, tattooing, cosmetic piercing, chiropody, light, electric or other special treatment of a like kind or vapour, sauna or other baths.
- 3.2.1 The application has been consulted on in accordance with the London Local Authorities Act 1991 and Tower Hamlets Regulations made under 10(1) of the Act.

This has included:

- a) A notice at the premises displayed by the applicant during the required period.
- b) A press advert placed in The East London Advertiser on 24th August 2023 by the applicant. This has can be found at **Appendix 2**
- c) The application being sent to the Police and London Fire Brigade on 14th August 2023.

Objection

- 3.3 Mehboob Ahmed Health and Safety Officer, Licensing and Safety Team has objected to the granting of this application. This objection has already been made available to the applicant. The objection is due to the following reasons, and can be found in **Appendix 3**:
 - The premises has a history of being improperly conducted because it has previously been found offering services of a sexual nature. This has resulted in Council revoking a previous licence on 14th July 2022. This printed decision for this hearing are attached to the objection in appendix 3.
 - Premises found appearing to provide special treatments without a licence (during application consultation period). Please see the onsite report and PACE Notebook entry attached to the objection in appendix 3.

4. Legislative provisions

- 4.1 Licences are granted subject to standard conditions.
- 4.2 Those Standard Conditions of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets were made under the London Local Authorities Act 1991, Section 10(1). It is the duty of any licence holder to be aware of and abide by those conditions. A blank copy of the standard conditions is exhibited as **Appendix 4.**
- 4.3 Under section 8 of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 the Council may refuse to grant a licence on the following grounds:

- (a) the premises are not structurally suitable for the purpose;
- (b) there is a likelihood of nuisance being caused by reason of the conduct, management or situation of the premises or the character of the relevant locality or the use to which any premises in the vicinity are put;
- (c) the persons concerned or intended to be concerned in the conduct or management of the premises used for special treatment could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper persons to hold such a license;
- (d) the persons giving the special treatment are not suitably qualified;
- (e) the premises have been or are being improperly conducted;
- (f) the premises are not provided with satisfactory means of lighting, sanitation and ventilation:
- (g) the means of heating the premises are not safe;
- (h) proper precautions against fire on the premises are not being taken;
- (i) they are not satisfied as to the safety of equipment used in the special treatment or as to the manner in which the treatment is to be given;
- (j) they are not satisfied as to the safety of the special treatment to be given;
- (k) satisfactory means of escape in case of fire and suitable means for fighting fire are not provided on the premises;
- (I) the applicant has, within the period of five years immediately preceding the application to the borough council, been convicted of an offence under this Part of this Act.

5. EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

7.1 There are no equalities implications.

8. OTHER STATUTORY IMPLICATIONS

- 8.1 Best Value implications: There are no best value implications.
- 8.2 Environmental considerations: There are no environmental implications.
- 8.3 Crime reduction: One of the key licensing objectives of the Council is to ensure that it does not licence premises that are liable to be a source of crime and disorder. The Council supports and assists with crime and disorder reduction by controlling those who manage premises open to members of the public and

- imposing conditions on relevant premises licences. Illegal activity has been proven to occur at the premises.
- 8.4 Safeguarding: There are no proven safeguarding impacts; however, premises that are managed in this way may employ underage persons or vulnerable adults. Therefore, there may be a positive safeguarding impact.
- 8.5 Risk Management: The Council will be at risk of legal challenge if its processes are not transparent and evidentially based.

9. COMMENTS OF THE CHIEF FINANCE OFFICER

9.1 There are no material financial implications arising from the recommendation. If the special treatment licence is not granted, the council will forego the license income and this will be managed within existing budget provision.

10. <u>COMMENTS OF LEGAL SERVICES</u>

- 10.1 Section 6 of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 ("the Act) requires that any premises to be used for special treatments is licensed ("a special treatment licence") by the Council. Special treatment covers a wide range of activities including body piercing, tattooing, acupuncture, massage, and sauna.
- 10.2 The application process for a special treatment licence is not prescribed in statute and may be (but need not be) the subject of regulations made by the Authority under s.7(4) of the Act. The application must be sent to the Commissioner of Police and to the London Fire Brigade, both of whom may object within 28 days. The Act expressly allows for late representations to be considered, at the Authority's discretion. Any other person may nonetheless object to the application.
- 10.3 As set out in paragraph 4 above, there are a number of statutory reasons upon which the Authority may refuse to grant a special treatment licence. These reasons include that:
 - the persons concerned or intended to be concerned in the management of the premises could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper persons to hold such a licence (s.8(c));
 - the premises have been or are being improperly conducted (s.8(e));
 - the applicant has, within the five years immediately preceding the application, been convicted of an offence under Part II of the Act (s.8(I)).
- 10.4 S.10 gives an Authority power to make regulations providing for standard conditions that will be deemed to apply to all licences granted under the Act, unless expressly amended or excluded. This power is in addition to the general power to impose appropriate conditions to individual licences under s.6.
- 10.5 Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010 requires the authority, in the exercise of its functions, to have due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct prohibited by the 2010 Act, to

advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and those who do not, and to foster good relations between those who share a relevant protected characteristic and those who do not. The relevant protected characteristics are age; disability gender reassignment; pregnancy and maternity; race; religion or belief; sex; sexual orientation. Members are required to have regards to the Act when making their decision.

Further to my objection to the granting of this application for a special treatment licence dated 5th September 2023, please find evidence in support of my objection.

As detailed in my objection mentioned above, this premises has a history of being improperly conducted because it has previously been found offering services of a sexual nature. This can be evidenced most recently where a licence for similar treatments was revoked by the Council at a hearing of the Licensing Committee on 14th July 2022.

As per section 8(e) of the above Act the Council may refused to grant an application for a licence on the ground that the premises have or are being improperly conducted. The attached printed minutes (**Appendix 1 – Printed Minutes**) of the Licensing Committee Hearing on 22nd July 2022 shows that the previous licence was revoked and that this was bought to the attention of the Licensing Committee due to test purchases carried out on 25th and 29th October 2021 where services of a sexual nature were offered.

Further to this as per section 8(c) of the above Act the Council may refuse to grant an application for a licence on the grounds that the person concerned or intended to be concerned in the conduct or management of the premises used for special treatment could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper persons to hold such a licence. During a visit to the premises on 1st September 2023 the premises appeared to be already offering special treatments without a licence. This was despite previous emails on 24th July and 15th August 2023 (Appendix 2 - Emails to Applicant) clearly stating not to provide special treatments until their application for a licence had been granted. During this visit on 1st September Pana Sooha an employee of the premises confirmed that massages were being provided, see appendix 3 – Onsite Report. This was further confirmed by two gentlemen



seen leaving the premises 10 minutes after my visit on 1st September 2023 who appeared to be customers (**Appendix 4 – Notebook Printout**).

It is therefore my view based on this evidence above that on the balance of probabilities, the premises is likely to again be used for immoral practices, namely services of a sexual nature. Moreover, given that the applicant appears to already be offering special treatments shows that the Council cannot have any faith that they will adhere to the Council's Standard Conditions for Special Treatment Licence, and, thus likely the premises will be improperly conducted.

1. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest.

2. ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION

2.1 London Local Authorities Act 1991 Hearing to revoke the special treatment licence for Genesis Thai Beauty Spa, Unit 2 Nagpal House, 1 Gunthorpe Street London E1 7QX

The Licensing Committee considered an application by the Licensing and Safety Team seeking the revocation of the special treatment licence held by Genesis New World Aldgate Ltd. in respect of Genesis Thai Beauty Spa, Unit 2 Nagpal House, 1 Gunthorpe Street, London, E1 ("the Premises"). The basis of the application was that two test purchases carried out in October 2021 had resulted in sexual services being offered by therapists.

The Committee was made aware that the licence holder had submitted a request to cancel the licence. The Committee was also aware of correspondence between the Licensing and Safety Team and the licence holder's solicitor in respect of this point. The Committee was advised that it was a matter of discretion to accept the cancellation or to proceed with the hearing. The Committee proceeded as Members thought it important to hear and determine the substantive application as the outcome may be relevant in respect of any future applications by the licence holder or for a new licence at the Premises.

The Committee heard from Mr. Lewis, who outlined the test purchases and the reasons why revocation was sought. The Premises were being improperly conducted, the activity alleged was tantamount to prostitution, such offences were often linked to other criminal activity, and the perpetuation of these activities tarnished the Borough's reputation.

The licence holder did not attend but the Committee noted the request to cancel and that the allegations were not admitted and had no bearing on the decision to request cancellation of the licence.

The Committee was satisfied as to the evidence of the test purchasers, which was in the agenda packs and which amounted to a breach of conditions 7B and 9 of the Council's standard conditions which apply to all special treatment licences. In the absence of any representations from the licence holder (and noting in any event that she has no intention of continuing the business) the Committee was satisfied that it was appropriate to revoke the licence on the basis of section 8(c) and 8(e) of the London Local Authorities Act, namely that the persons concerned in the conduct or management of the premises could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper to hold such a licence, and that the premises have been or are being improperly conducted.

Accordingly, the Committee unanimously;

RESOLVED

That the **Revocation** of the special treatment licence for Genesis Thai Beauty Spa, Unit 2 Nagpal House, 1 Gunthorpe Street, London, E1 7RG be **GRANTED.**

2.2 London Local Authorities Act 1991 Hearing to consider the revocation of the Special Treatment Licence for Natural Treatment, 35 Artillery Lane, London E1 7LP

The Licensing Committee considered an application by the Licensing and Safety Team seeking the revocation of the special treatment licence held by Yani Wang in respect of Natural Treatment, 35 Artillery Lane, London, E1 ("the Premises"). The basis of the application was that two test purchases carried out in October 2021 had resulted in sexual services being offered by therapists.

The Committee heard from Mr. Miah, who outlined the test purchases and the reasons why revocation was sought. Aside from the sexual activity, the report noted that there were also breaches of the conditions restricting massages from being given by persons of the opposite sex to the person receiving the treatment and requiring therapists to be approved. The Premises were being improperly conducted, the activity alleged was tantamount to prostitution, such offences were often linked to other criminal activity, and the perpetuation of these activities tarnished the Borough's reputation.

Ms. Wang attended and read out a prepared statement. She referred to having been "cheated" by the previous owner when she purchased the business in March 2020. Her statement referred to having heard of sexual services being offered in massage parlours but was nothing to do with her, but she now "...had to deal with the problem, the problem that was left over from the previous owner."

Ms. Wang spoke to her thirty years' of experience in this industry. She suggested it should be the masseuses who should be regulated and suffer the risk of being unable to work if they offered sexual services, rather than penalising the employer. She accepted that there was a high risk of sexual services being offered but also accepted that her employees were doing what others do and they were just unlucky. She also suggested some form of collusion between officers and premises. In a second statement, Ms. Wang provided screenshots of messages between her and the massage therapist, in which the therapist denied offering the services. Ms. Wang said she did not believe that either the test purchaser or her massage therapist would lie. She suggested that she should have been made aware much sooner of the incidents.

During questions from Members, Ms. Wang accepted that the operation of the Premises was her responsibility yet suggested that it was not possible to control what goes on once the door to the therapy room is closed. She told the Committee that she had not used the previous owner's staff. Mr. Miah was asked why it had taken until February 2022 before these allegations were brought to Ms. Wang's attention. He explained that the service had a number of cases to investigate, not just this one, and those took time. Evidence needed to be obtained and lines of enquiry pursued and it took a considerable period of time to be able to put cases together for either Committee or for referring to Legal Services.

The Committee was satisfied as to the evidence of the test purchasers, which was in the agenda packs and which amounted to a breach of conditions 7B, 8A and 9 of the Council's standard conditions which apply to all special

treatment licences. The Committee did not find Ms. Wang to be at all credible. Whilst her prepared statements appeared to suggest that these problems had materialised under the previous owner's management and that they had only come to light after that, this did not fit with her own evidence. She had purchased the business in March 2020, she had not taken on the staff, and the test purchases had occurred in October 2021. She accepted her responsibility and yet sought to downplay it. She appeared to suggest that it was simply not possible to control the actions of her therapist.

In addition, Ms. Wang knew or ought to have known of the condition requiring all therapists to be approved. The therapist in October 2021 was not approved.

The Council's standard conditions and the statutory grounds reasons for revocation are all focused on the safety and suitability of the Premises for the treatments and for those working and visiting. It is the responsibility of the licence holder to ensure compliance and if they do not know how to do so then it calls into question their fitness and propriety to hold a licence. The Committee was satisfied that the Ms. Wang was not exercising proper control of the Premises. She was failing to comply with at least three conditions and appeared to suggest that the offer of sexual activity was simply impossible to control. In light of everything that it had heard, the Committee was satisfied that it was appropriate to revoke the licence on the basis of section 8(c), 8(d) and 8(e) of the London Local Authorities Act, namely that the persons concerned in the conduct or management of the premises could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper to hold such a licence, that treatments were being given by people who were not suitably qualified, and that the premises have been or are being improperly conducted.

Accordingly, the Committee unanimously;

RESOLVED

That the **Revocation** of the special treatment licence for Natural Treatment, 35 Artillery Lane, London, E1 7LP be **GRANTED**.

2.3 London Local Authorities Act 1991 Hearing to consider revoking the special treatment licence for Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 Whites Row, London E1 7NF

The Licensing Committee considered an application by the Licensing and Safety Team seeking the revocation of the special treatment licence held by Cheung Lai Kwan in respect of Vanilla Thai Massage, 1 White's Row, London, E1 ("the Premises"). The basis of the application was that two test purchases carried out in October 2021 had resulted in sexual services being offered by therapists.

The Committee was also aware of correspondence between the Licensing and Safety Team and the licence holder's solicitor which stated, among other things, that Ms. Kwan had sold the business, that she had been in Hong Kong

since December 2019, that she was not intending to return to the UK in the foreseeable future, and that she has no further interest in the business. The Committee was advised that this did not meet the requirements of the London Local Authorities Act 1991 for a formal request to cancel.

The Committee heard from Mr. Ali, who outlined the test purchases and the reasons why revocation was sought. The Premises were being improperly conducted, the activity alleged was tantamount to prostitution, such offences were often linked to other criminal activity, and the perpetuation of these activities tarnished the Borough's reputation.

The licence holder did not attend. The Committee noted the correspondence submitted on her behalf.

The Committee was satisfied as to the evidence of the test purchasers, which was in the agenda packs and which amounted to a breach of conditions 7B and 9 of the Council's standard conditions which apply to all special treatment licences. In the absence of any representations from the licence holder (and noting in any event that she appears to no longer be involved in the business) and given her long absence during which she cannot have been exercising proper control, the Committee was satisfied that it was appropriate to revoke the licence on the basis of section 8(c) and 8(e) of the London Local Authorities Act, namely that the persons concerned in the conduct or management of the premises could be reasonably regarded as not being fit and proper to hold such a licence, and that the premises have been or are being improperly conducted.

Accordingly, the Committee unanimously;

RESOLVED

MASSAGE AND SPECIAL TREATMENT LICENCE CONDITIONS

The COUNCIL of the LONDON BOROUGH OF TOWER HAMLETS, under the provisions of LONDON LOCAL AUTHORITIES ACT 1991, hereby authorise the person(s) or company named in the schedule to carry on, up to and including an establishment for the giving of massage or special treatment specified in the schedule at the address and in the trade name or style or title so specified subject to the following conditions:-

- 1. The establishment shall be carried on only for the treatment or business and in the trade name or style or title specified in this licence and at the address mentioned herein.
- 2. All notices and advertisements issued by or on behalf of the establishment shall bear the trade name or style or title aforesaid and the name of individual assistants shall not be given in such notices and advertisements.
- 3. The licensee shall at once notify the Council in writing addressed to the Environmental Health Commercial Team Manager, 4th Floor Tower Hamlets Town Hall 160 Whitechapel Road London E1 1BJ, of any change in the name or private address of the licensee or in the treatment afforded or the nature of the business carried on at the establishment.
- 4. Except with the written consent of the Council, the licensee shall not employ in the conduct of the establishment any person (a) whose licence has been revoked or to whom a licence has been refused on the ground that such person is unsuitable to hold a licence to carry on an establishment for massage or special treatment, or (b) who is unsuitable to be so employed on the ground that misconduct in connection with the employment of such person in an establishment for massage or special treatment has been proved to the satisfaction of the Council; and, except with such consent, the licensee shall not allow or permit any such person to be directly or indirectly interested in the business carried on at the establishment.
- 5. The licensee, if a company within the meaning of the companies Act, 1948, or any Act amending the same shall forthwith notify the Council in writing of any change in the constitution of the directorate of such company during the currency of this licence
- 6. All treatments shall be given only by persons approved by the Council or, provided that the written consent of the Council has been obtained, under the personal supervision of a person approved by the Council.
- 7. The following treatments shall, unless the consent of the Council in writing has otherwise been obtained, only be permitted by a qualified physiotherapist in accordance with the directions of a registered medical practitioner with specific reference to the client to whom the treatment is to be given:

 Massage for curative purposes, long and short wave diathermy; ultra-sonic treatments; treatment of moles, ultra-violet ray treatment and electro-sleep therapy
- 8. No instrument, apparatus or equipment shall be used in the establishment without the prior written consent of the Council.

- 9. The licensee shall at all times take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of their clients when on the establishment.
- 10. The Licensee shall ensure that with exception of those persons receiving treatment in accordance with the conditions of this licence all clients present in any part of the establishment shall be decently and properly attired and separate changing accommodation for males and females shall be provided.
- 11. The walls and ceilings of any treatment room or waiting room shall be (i) maintained in a sound structural and clean condition and the surfaces shall be such as to facilitate easy cleansing.
 - There shall be provided in every treatment room suitable floor covering (ii) which shall be such as to facilitate easy cleansing.
 - There shall be adequate light and ventilation to any treatment or waiting room either by natural of artificial means.
 - (iv) There shall be provided in every treatment room a suitable wash-hand basin or basins provided with an adequate supply of hot and cold water.
 - There shall be provided, in respect of a wash-hand basin, soap, a (v) nailbrush and a supply of disposable towels or a clean towel available at all times.
 - (vi) There shall be provided in every treatment and waiting room suitable and sufficient means for heating and a reasonable room temperature shall be maintained.
 - (vii) Where it is intended that more than one person shall be treated in a room, suitable screening shall be provided to maintain privacy.
 - (viii) There shall be provided in respect of every establishment sanitary accommodation to the standard laid down in regulations made under the relevant registration such sanitary accommodation to be available to and readily accessible for clients.
 - There shall be provided proper means for securing the cleanliness of all instruments, towels and materials and equipment used in connection with the establishment.

Further condition to be included in appropriate cases:-

12. Unless otherwise expressly permitted by the Council when treatment is given or is being received to any part of the body other than the neck and head or feet and legs below the knee or hands and arms and is not being so given by a fully qualified physiotherapist of other person entered on the register of the appropriate professional organisation whose qualifications have been approved by the Council, the treatment may be given only to persons of the same sex as the person giving the treatment and persons of the opposite sex shall not be present.

<u>N.B</u>.

- (I) The licence is not transferable either as regards the person to whom, to the premises in respect of which, it is granted.
- (II) The licensees shall on application for renewal of their licence submit to the Council a certificate signed by a competent electrician certifying the safety of all electrical equipment and apparatus used within the terms of the licence.
