When considering whether or not they have a declarable interest, Members should consult pages 181 to184 of the Council's Constitution. Please note that all Members present at a Committee meeting (in whatever capacity) are required to declare any personal or prejudicial interests.

A personal interest is, generally, one that would affect a Member (either directly or through a connection with a relevant person or organisation) more than other people in London, in respect of the item of business under consideration at the meeting. If a member of the public, knowing all the relevant facts, would view a Member's personal interest in the item under consideration as so substantial that it would appear likely to prejudice the Member's judgement of the public interest, then the Member has a prejudicial personal interest.

## Consequences:

- If a Member has a personal interest: he/she must declare the interest but can stay, speak and vote.
- If the Member has prejudicial personal interest: he/she must declare the interest, cannot speak or vote on the item and must leave the room.

When declaring an interest, Members are requested to specify the nature of the interest, the particular agenda item to which the interest relates and to also specify whether the interest is of a personal or personal and prejudicial nature. This procedure is designed to assist the public's understanding of the meeting and is also designed to enable a full entry to be made in the Statutory Register of Interests which is kept by the Head of Democratic Renewal and Engagement on behalf of the Monitoring Officer.

## REPORT OF SERVICE HEAD DEMOCRATIC RENEWAL AND ENGAGEMENT

## (i) LONDON CITY AIRPORT CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE (LCACC)

At the previous meeting of the Committee in February 2007 the Committee received two nominations for appointment as the Tower Hamlets representative to the LCACC. The two nominations received were Councillor Bill Turner and Mr Eric Pemberton. The Committee agreed to delay an appointment to the LCACC until this meeting in order to seek confirmation of the eligibility of Mr Pemberton to represent Tower Hamlets.

Subsequent advice from the airport has stated that whilst Tower Hamlets may appoint Mr Pemberton, due to the likelihood of substantial development occurring at the airport in the near future they feel that an officer or Member of the Council will be best able to represent the whole of the Borough across a variety of topics. Similarly, given the forthcoming level of activity they feel that the establishment of a direct channel of communication (i.e. through an officer or Member) with the Council would be preferable and more easily facilitate the dissemination of information from LCACC meetings.
(ii) ALDGATE AND ALLHALLOWS BARKING EXHIBITION FOUNDATION

In June 2006 the Committee appointed Councillor Helal U Abbas to this body for a three year period terminating June 2009. In the event advice was received from the Foundation that because Councillor Abbas was appointed to replace Councillor Salique he could only serve for the remainder of Councillor Salique's term of office (until March 2007).

This initial term now having expired, the Foundation is seeking a nomination from Tower Hamlets to cover the period March 2007 March 2010. Therefore the Committee is invited to confirm Councillor Abbas' appointment for that period.

## Summary

1. This report sets out the Returning Officer's representations on the review of polling districts and polling places and the further steps which must be taken to complete this process.

## Recommendations

2. That the Committee;
(1) agree that formal notice of holding the review be published;
(2) note the preliminary representations from the Returning Officer and authorise the Interim Electoral Services Manager to finalise and publish them within thirty calendar days of this meeting;
(3) note any issues raised by elected members for consideration during the review process;
(4) authorise the Interim Electoral Services Manager on behalf of the Returning Officer to seek representations from persons who have particular expertise in relation to access to premises and facilities for persons who have different forms of disability; and
(5) authorise the Interim Electoral Services Manager on behalf of the Returning Officer seek representations from individual electors, ward councillors, local constituency political parties and independent candidates.

## Background

3. In the report to the previous meeting on $13^{\text {th }}$ February 2007, members were advised that the review of polling places must be completed by the end of 2007 under the new legislation (section 16 of the Electoral Administration Act 2006). This report initiates the formal part of the process whereby the Returning Officer makes representations to the Council about polling districts and polling places. Within thirty days these representations must be formally published. The Council is then required to seek representations from "persons with particular expertise" regarding access for the different forms of disability and from electors who wish to make representations. The Council then decides what the outcome will be and gives its reasons.
4. In April 2006 the Head of Facilities reviewed all polling stations for disabled access prior to the election and temporary ramps etc were provided for those polling places that required it. This would always be the case but there may be other reasons why a disabled group consider changes should be made.
5. The Returning Officer wrote to all members on $19^{\text {th }}$ February 2007 seeking views on the review and feedback from the polling station officers in the May 2006 elections. At the date of this report no comments have been received. Members are reminded that whilst it is acknowledged that many schools do not wish to have polling stations within their boundary or school building it is often not possible to find alternative locations for schools currently used.

## Definitions

6. To ensure clarity in discussing issues arising from the review the following definitions are used:
polling district; a geographical sub-division of an electoral area ie a UK parliamentary constituency, a European parliamentary electoral region, a ward or an electoral division.
polling place; a geographical area in which a polling station is located. however, as there is no legal definition of what a poling place is, the geographical area could be defined as tightly as a particular building or as widely as the entire polling district.
polling station; the actual area where the process of voting takes place, and must be located within the polling place designated for the particular polling district.

## Returning Officer's representations

6. Once the review has been initiated the authority is required to consult the Returning Officer who must make representations to the authority. These representations are:
(a) generally there should no more than 1,500 electors allocated to a
polling station subject to the practicability of providing an additional polling station;
(b) the polling place at a portacabin adjacent to Winford House (BE1) should be relocated if practicable (Bow East);
(c) a new polling district BE5 to vote at either Bow Community Hall or Bow Secondary School (Bow East);
(d) a new polling station for district BW4 to vote at Malmesbury Primary School, if practicable (Bethnal Green West);
(e) a new polling station for district BBB2 to vote at Clara Grant Primary School, (Bromley by Bow);
(f) a new polling station for district EIL1to vote at St Saviour's Primary School, (East India \& Lansbury);
(g) a new polling station for district MGT2 to vote at The Tramshed, Digby Street (Mile End \& Globe Town);
(h) polling district MEE1 to vote at the Adult Services Resource Centre, Southern Grove, if practicable (to replace Council Offices, 60 Southern Grove which will no longer be available) (Mile End East);
(i) a new polling station for district MI1 to vote at Seven Mills Primary School, Malabar Street, if practicable (Millwall);
(j) a new polling station for district SH2 to vote at St Mary \& St Michael Primary School, Sutton Street, if practicable (Shadwell);
(k) a new polling station for district SH4 to vote at or near Royal Foundation of St Katherine (possibly additional Portacabin) (Shadwell);
(I) a new polling district SDS4 to reduce pressure on Cayley Primary School, Aston Street, which cannot accommodate an additional polling station (St Dunstan's \& Stepney Green);
(m) a new polling station for district SDS3 to vote at Sir John Cass Foundation \& Redcoat Secondary School, if practicable (St Dunstan's \& Stepney Green);
(n) a new polling station for district SK4 to vote at Hermitage Primary School, Vaughan Way, if practicable (St Katherine’s \& Wapping);
(n) a new polling district WE4 to reduce pressure on William Davis Primary School, Wood Close, which cannot accommodate an additional polling station (Weavers);
(o) a new polling station for district WH1 to vote at Kobi Nazrul primary

School, if practicable (Whitechapel);
(p) a new polling station for polling district WH2 (to replace Cheviot House which may no longer available) (Whitechapel);
(q) polling district WH 3 to be split by the creation of a new polling district WH5 to vote at new polling places at Smithy Street Primary School and Redlands Primary School respectively, if practicable, (to replace Stepney Library which has closed) (Whitechapel).
7. A complete schedule of existing and proposed polling districts and polling places with commentary as appropriate is attached as appendix $A$.

## Other representations

8. The authority is required to seek representations from such persons as it thinks have particular expertise in relation to access to premises or facilities for persons who have different forms of disability. Such persons must have an opportunity to make representations and to comment on the returning officer's representations. A list of potential consultees has been identified in liaison with the Corporate Equalities Team and is attached at appendix B.
9. Any elector may make representations on the designations of polling places to the relevant authority. The formal notice to be published after this meeting will invite such representations and the review will also be publicised on the website and in East End Life. Although not required by the legislation it is recognised as good practice to consult widely amongst the key stakeholders in the electoral process. It is therefore also intended to invite further representations from ward councillors and to consult local constituency political parties and independent candidates who contested the last borough council elections.

## Process

10. Following this meeting formal notice of the commencement of the review will be published at the Town Hall, at other venues where official council notices are published, on the website and in East End Life. Within thirty days of the meeting the Returning Officer's representations (paragraph 6) must also be published. It is proposed that the period for consultation and receipt of representations should extend until $31^{\text {st }}$ July 2007 after which final proposals will be drawn up for consideration by this Committee on $14^{\text {th }}$ November. This Committee's recommendations will then be considered by the Council meeting on $28^{\text {th }}$ November. The polling districts and polling places will then be formally designated.

## Comments of Assistant Chief Executive (Legal Services)

11. It is a legal requirement to carry out the review of polling places this year before $31^{\text {st }}$ December 2007 and thereafter every four years in accordance with the requirements of the Electoral Administration Act 2006 (see appendix C).

## Comments of Chief Financial Officer

12. The costs of the review will be met from within budget.

## Equal Opportunities Implications

13. It is essential that disabilities issues are taken into account in election matters particularly in the polling station review.

## Anti Poverty Implications

14. There are no implications in this report.

## Sustainable Action for a Greener Environment

15. Within the constraints of the suitability and availability of the accommodation, polling places are located so as to minimise the distance electors need to travel to cast their vote.

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## Extract from the Representation of the People Act 1983 (as inserted by Section 16 of the Electoral Administration Act 2006)

## SCHEDULE AI (Section 180)

## REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICIS AND POLLING PLACES

1 The relevant duthority must publish notice of the holding of a review.
2 The authority musi consult the returning afficer for every parliamentary election held in a constituency which is wholly or partly ir its orea.

3 (1) Every such returning officer must make representations to the authority.
(2) The representations must include information as to the location of polling siations (existing or proposed) within polling places (existing or proposed).
(3) The representations must be published in such manner as is prescribed

4 (1) The authorily must seek representations from such persons as it thinks have particular expertise in relation to access to memises or facilities for persons who have different forms of disability
(2) Such persons inust have an opporiunity--
(a) to make representailons:
(b) to comment on the returinig officer's representations.

5 Any elector in a constituency situated in whole or in part in the authority's area may make representations.

6 Representations made by any person iri con ection with a review of polling places may include proposolis for specified altemalive polling places.

7 On completion of a review the authorily must-
(a) give reasons for its decisions in the review;
(b) publish such other information as is prescribed

BETHNAL GREEN AND BOW BOROUGH CONSTITUENCY Nine wards:Bethnal Green North, Bethnal Green South, Bow East, Bow West, Mile End and Globe Town, St Dunstan's and Stepney Green, Spitalfields and Banglatown, Weavers, Whitechapel.

POPLAR AND LIMEHOUSE BOROUGH CONSTITUENCY Eight wards:Blackwall and Cubitt Town, Bromley-by-Bow, East India and Lansbury, Limehouse, Mile End East, Millwall, St Katherine's and Wapping, Shadwell.

On $28^{\text {th }}$ February 2007 the Secretary of State for Constitutional Affairs laid the report before both Houses of Parliament together with a draft Order in Council giving effect, without modification, to the recommendations in the report. It is anticipated that the Order in Council will be approved by the late April/early May.
