#### Note from the Chief Executive

In accordance with the Council's Code of Conduct, Members must declare any **personal interests** they have in any item on the agenda or as they arise during the course of the meeting. Members must orally indicate to which item their interest relates. If a Member has a personal interest he/she must also consider whether or not that interest is **a prejudicial personal interest** and take the necessary action. When considering whether or not they have a declarable interest, Members should consult pages 195 to 198 of the Council's Constitution. Please note that all Members present at a Committee meeting (in whatever capacity) are required to declare any personal or prejudicial interests.

A **personal interest** is, generally, one that would affect a Member (either directly or through a connection with a relevant person or organisation) more than other people in London, in respect of the item of business under consideration at the meeting. If a member of the public, knowing all the relevant facts, would view a Member's personal interest in the item under consideration as so substantial that it would appear likely to prejudice the Member's judgement of the public interest, then the Member has a **prejudicial personal interest**.

#### Consequences:

- If a Member has a **personal interest:** he/she must declare the interest but can stay, speak and vote.
- If the Member has **prejudicial personal interest:** he/she must declare the interest, cannot speak or vote on the item and must leave the room.

When declaring an interest, Members are requested to specify the nature of the interest, the particular agenda item to which the interest relates and to also specify whether the interest is of a personal or personal and prejudicial nature. This procedure is designed to assist the public's understanding of the meeting and is also designed to enable a full entry to be made in the Statutory Register of Interests which is kept by the Service Head, Democratic Services on behalf of the Monitoring Officer.

#### 6. URGENT ITEM - AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

Pursuant to Section 100B(4)(b) Local Government Act 1972 (as amended) the Chair considered that the following item should be considered at the meeting as a matter of urgency to facilitate effective enforcement of new responsibilities with effect from 1 July 2007.

#### Amendments to the Constitution

Graham White, Legal Services, reported that two sets of Functions and Responsibilities Regulations had been made amending the functions not to be the responsibility of an authority's executive. In accordance with the powers delegated to the Monitoring Officer in Article 15.01(5) of the Constitution to make revisions to the Constitution to reflect changes in legislation Isabella Freeman had added the new functions to the list of Council functions in paragraph 3.1.1.2 of the Constitution. The new functions related to enforcement under the Gambling Act 2005 and the determination of fees for premises licenses and in respect of enforcement of the prohibition of smoking in public places.

The Committee was requested to delegate the functions to Chief Officers to facilitate effective implementation from 1 July 2007 when the Regulations take effect.

- 1.1 Two sets of Regulations have made amendments to the core functions and responsibilities regulations which are set out in their entirety in the Council's Constitution. The Monitoring Officer has effected the changes necessitated by the legislation under the powers contained in Article 15 of the Constitution and the Committee is asked to note the changes.
- 1.2 In respect of new non executive functions derived from gambling legislation, elections and smoke-free premises the Committee is invited to delegate the exercise of such functions to the Corporate Director, Communities, Localities and Culture.

#### 2 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 2.1 Cabinet is recommended to:-
  - Note the changes to the non executive functions set out in the Constitution in consequence of The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) (Amendment No. 3) and (Amendment No. 4) Regulations 2007 as shown at schedule 1 to this report.
  - (ii) Authorise the Corporate Director, Communities, Localities and Culture to exercise the Council's powers in respect of the new functions referred to above.

#### 3 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) Regulations 2000 set out a comprehensive list of functions which are non executive functions. Additional regulations amending the core regulations have been made regularly ever since.
- 3.2 Part 3 of the Council's Constitution sets out all the functions specified in the regulations and whether the exercise of those functions has been delegated to a Committee or to an officer.
- 3.3 At its meeting on 13 June 2007, the Committee noted the changes to the functions as a result of The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 2007 and made provision for the functions to be exercised by a Committee or by officers.

#### 4 **NEW REGULATIONS**

- 4.1 On 10 July 2007 The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) (Amendment No. 3) Regulations 2007 were laid before Parliament. The provisions came into effect on 1 August and 1 September 2007.
- 4.2 The Regulations make amendments to the core regulations in relation to various Gambling Act functions by adding words to a number of provisions determined under enactments repealed by the Gambling Act 2005 to enable those provisions to apply where applications made under them had been made but not determined before the commencement of the repeal. In addition various new functions arising under the Gambling Act 2005 were added.
- 4.3 On 11 September 2007 The Local Authorities (Functions and Responsibilities) (England) (Amendment No. 4) Regulations 2007 were laid before Parliament. The provisions came into effect on 2 October 2007.
- 4.4 The Regulations correct and update various references to listed buildings and conservation areas in the original 2000 Regulations and correct certain drafting errors in the 2007 Amendment No. 3 Regulations. Additional functions are specified regarding elections and in respect of smoke-free premises.
- 4.5 Under Article 15.01(5) the Monitoring Officer has power to make revisions to the Constitution to reflect changes in legislation and the changes to the list of functions and the statutory power authorising such functions as specified by the regulations have been added to the Constitution. These changes comprise the emboldened words in columns 1 and 2 of schedule 1 attached to this report.
- 4.6 In respect of the new functions the emboldened words in the third column are the recommendations for delegation from the Council to an officer, in every case the Corporate Director, Communities, Localities and Culture. Without delegation responsibility for the functions will remain with the Council, which is clearly

inappropriate for functions of an operational nature, and the Committee is recommended to so delegate.

#### 3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The General Purposes Committee on 29<sup>th</sup> May 2007 considered a report setting out the steps involved in the establishment of the Arms Length Management Organisation, Tower Hamlets Homes (THH). The Committee agreed the process for the appointment of Councillors to the Shadow Board of THH.
- 3.2 There is no legal requirement for these appointments to be made on the basis of political proportionality. Nevertheless the Committee agreed that the 5 Council representatives to the Shadow Board be drawn 3 from the Majority Group and 2 from the Minority Parties, and authorised the Assistant Chief Executive to agree the appointment of Members in accordance with this allocation following receipt of nominations from the political groups.
- 3.3 Councillors Marc Francis, Alex Heslop and Shafiqul Haque have been appointed to the Shadow Board following nomination by the Majority Group. However, in the event, no nominations have been received by the Assistant Chief Executive from the minority parties. It is important for the effective operation of the THH Shadow Board that there is a full complement of Council nominees and in order to ensure this it is **recommended** that the Committee remove the condition relating to allocation of the places between the political groups.
- 3.4 The Majority Group has indicated that they wish to nominate Councillors Sirajul Islam and Denise Jones as additional representatives to the Shadow Board and the Committee is further **recommended** to approve these nominations.

#### 1 SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report informs the Committee of new duties and responsibilities for the electoral registration officer introduced by the Electoral Administration Act 2006 and subsequent regulations.
- 1.2 In order to fulfil those obligations the electoral registration officer will need to delegate some of the functions and the recommendation of the Electoral Commission is that the Council should formally appoint a deputy electoral registration officer.

#### 2 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 It is recommended that the Assistant Chief Executive (Legal Services) be appointed as deputy electoral registration officer.

## 3 BACKGROUND

3.1 Section 8 Representation of the People Act 1983 requires there to be an electoral registration officer responsible for the registration of electors and that a London borough Council shall appoint an officer of the Council to be that registration officer. The Council has appointed the Chief Executive.

#### 4 NEW DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 4.1 The Electoral Administration Act 2006 and subsequent regulations have introduced a duty for the electoral registration officer to take the necessary steps to maintain an accurate and complete electoral register. Not only is there a need to ensure every person who is entitled to be registered has an entry, but there is also a duty to remove entries from the register for those electors who are no longer eligible.
- 4.2 The Act has introduced two new or significantly changed systems for removing entries from the electoral register. The first, objection, has been amended so that it is now allowed at any time. The second, review, allows the electoral registration officer to decide if a particular entry in the register should remain or if the elector is no longer eligible to be on the register.
- 4.3 The Regulations provide a detailed process for the determination of objections. In certain circumstances the electoral registration officer may determine objections, but other objections can only be determined following a hearing conducted by the electoral registration officer. There are strict time limits within which hearings and subsequent determinations must take place, and these are within days rather than weeks.
- 4.4 The review procedure may lead the electoral registration officer to serve on an elector a notice that he believes the person is not entitled to be registered and this may result in the elector requesting a hearing. Alternatively an electoral registration officer may decide to go directly to a hearing where it would be more practicable to have a hearing to decide the matter than to conduct a review by post. The time limit for such hearing is somewhat more relaxed than in the case of an objection but nevertheless needs to be determined in a timely manner.
- 4.5 At present the volume of objections which may be received is unknown, but in any event given the short time scale involved in convening hearings, it is unlikely that the electoral registration officer will be able to preside personally due to other commitments, and another officer should be authorised to act for him.
- 4.6 The hearings are quasi-judicial proceedings with an appeal to the County Court and the Electoral Commission considers that it would be inappropriate to delegate these duties to an officer who is not appointed by the Council either as electoral registration officer or deputy electoral registration officer.
- 4.7 Accordingly it would be appropriate to appoint a deputy electoral registration officer with authority to deputise for the electoral registration officer in relation to the whole of the former's duties. As the procedures carry legal consequences, the appropriate officer to undertake these responsibilities is the Assistant Chief Executive (Legal Services) and it is so recommended.

#### 3. BACKGROUND

3.1. On 13 June 2007 the General Purposes Committee received nominations from the political groups and agreed appointments to a wide range of external bodies for the municipal year 2007/08. A number of further appointments are now required either where the Council has received a new invitation to nominate a representative, or where a query has arisen in respect of the Council's nomination as set out below:

#### 4. ENGLISH HERITAGE - HISTORIC ENVIRONMENT CHAMPION

- 4.1. Councillor Denise Jones, Leader of the Council, was appointed as the Historic Environment Champion for Tower Hamlets by the General Purposes Committee on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2007. Although at that point only 3 months remained of the municipal year, the minutes of the meeting did not stipulate that the appointment should extend beyond May 2007 and due to an administrative oversight this appointment was omitted from the schedule of nominations for 2007/08 submitted to the Committee on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2007.
- 4.2. Cllr Jones has confirmed that she is happy to continue to serve as the Borough's Historic Environment Champion and the Committee is therefore **recommended** formally to confirm the re-appointment of **Cllr Denise Jones** to this position for the remainder of the municipal year 2007/08.

## 5. ISLE OF DOGS COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

- 5.1. The Council is invited to nominate two representatives to the Community Foundation. The organisation has asked that these should be one member and one officer, but the appointments are at the discretion of the Council and indeed during 2006/07 two Councillors were appointed.
- 5.2. On 13th June 2007 the General Purposes Committee appointed Cllr Shiria Khatun and an officer to serve as the Council's representatives. However, Members have now indicated that they feel it would be preferable to revert to the previous position and to nominate two councillors to the Community Foundation, to include one of the local ward councillors.
- 5.3. The Conservative Group has nominated Cllr Tim Archer. The Committee is therefore **recommended** to appoint **Cllr Shiria Khatun** and **Cllr Tim Archer** to serve as the Council's representatives on the Isle of Dogs Community Foundation for the remainder of the municipal year 2007/08.

## 6. MUDCHUTE ASSOCIATION

6.1. The Council is invited to appoint a representative to the Mudchute Association and during 2006/07 this was Cllr Rupert Eckhardt. Due to an administrative error the General Purposes Committee on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2007 received no nomination to serve as the Council's representative during 2007/08.

6.2. The Conservative Group have confirmed that Cllr Eckhardt is happy to continue to serve and the Committee is therefore **recommended** to confirm the appointment of **Cllr Rupert Eckhardt** to serve at the Council's representative on the Mudchute Association for the remainder of the municipal year 2007/08.

#### 7. THAMES GATEWAY LONDON PARTNERSHIP

- 7.1. During 2006/07, Cllr Ohid Ahmed was appointed to serve at the Council's representative on both the London Thames Gateway Development Corporation (LTGDC) Board and the Thames Gateway London Partnership (TGLP).
- 7.2. The LTGDC appointment is made for a 4 year term of office and no appointment was therefore required for 2007/08. However, due to a misunderstanding the General Purposes Committee on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2007 also did not receive a nomination for Cllr Ohid Ahmed's continued appointment to the TGLP. In the absence of a nomination from the Labour Group, Cllr Peter Golds was appointed.
- 7.3. It has now been clarified that the TGLP appointment needs to be renewed on an annual basis and the Labour Group has confirmed that it wishes to nominate Cllr Ohid Ahmed to continue in this role.
- 7.4. The Committee is therefore **recommended** to appoint **CIIr Ohid Ahmed** to serve as the Council's representative on the Thames Gateway London Partnership for the reminder of the municipal year 2007/08.

## 8. OLDER PEOPLE'S CHAMPION

- 8.1. The Government's National Service Framework (NSF) for Older People introduced the concept of 'Older People's Champions' individuals (who may be councillors, officers or others) who would play a key role in promoting the interests of older people, particularly in health and social care.
- 8.2. The Government's recommendation is that each local authority should nominate an elected Councillor to lead for older people across their council. This Councillor would aim to ensure that older people become and remain a priority within the council and would support the implementation of the NSF and the wider older people's programme. They would help to ensure that older people are involved in developing services and work with colleagues on the council to promote an active healthy life and challenge age discrimination where it exists.
- 8.3. Councillor Ann Jackson, Mayor of Tower Hamlets, has indicated that she would be happy to be nominated as the Members' Older People's Champion for the Borough. The Committee is therefore **recommended** to appoint **Clir Ann Jackson** as the Member Older People's Champion for Tower Hamlets.

## 9. EAST LONDON NURSING SOCIETY TRUST

9.1. The Council is invited to appoint three representatives to the Trust, each serving for a four year term. The nominees do not have to be Councillors. Existing

appointments are Cllr Oliur Rahman (to January 2009) and Ms Anna Lynch (to November 2010). General Purposes Committee on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2007 appointed Cllr Anwara Ali and Ms Lesley Pavitt also to serve (to June 2011).

9.2. Ms Lesley Pavitt has indicated that due to other commitments she is unable to devote as much time to this work as she would wish and has had to tender her resignation from the Trust. The Committee is therefore recommended to **note** the resignation of Ms Pavitt; **note** that **CIIr Oliur Rahman** and **Ms Anna Lynch** continue to represent the Council on the East London Nursing Society Trust as above; and **confirm** the appointment of **CIIr Anwara Ali** as the Council's third representative, to serve until June 2011.
