Dispatches Programme – Monday 1st March 2010

The Leader of the Council, Councillor Lutfur Rahman, referred to a television documentary 'Dispatches' that had been broadcast by Channel 4 on Monday evening. He stated that members of the administration were not complacent about the issues raised but they would not be distracted from their work on behalf of the people of the borough. The Council was committed to the highest

standards of probity and the programme had contained no direct allegations of wrong doing about the allocation of funds nor any new issues regarding staffing. The Leader rejected those who sought to divide the community and stressed the Council's Members were committed to One Tower Hamlets.

5. BUDGET AND COUNCIL TAX 2010/11

5.1 Report of the Cabinet Meeting of 10th February 2010

The Council considered the report of the Cabinet meeting on 10th February 2010 containing the proposals of the Executive for the Council's Budget and Council Tax for 2010/11.

Three amendments had been notified in advance in accordance with the Council Procedure Rules and these amendments, together in each case with officer comments, were circulated to the meeting in the pack of tabled documents.

It was **MOVED** by Councillor Ohid Ahmed and **SECONDED** by Councillor Lutfur Rahman – "That the recommendations contained in the 10th February 2010 report of the Cabinet be agreed."

Councillor Ohid Ahmed, Lead Member for Resources and Performance, introduced the report and recommendations of the Cabinet and outlined the key elements of the Executive's proposed budget for 2010/11.

MOVED as an **AMENDMENT** by Councillor Timothy Archer, **SECONDED** by Councillor David Snowdon – "That the motion be amended as per the tabled motion from Councillor Archer (attached at Appendix A).

MOVED as a further **AMENDMENT** by Councillor Abjol Miah, **SECONDED** by Councillor Dulal Uddin – "That the motion be amended as per the tabled motion from Councillor Miah (attached at Appendix B).

MOVED as a further **AMENDMENT** by Councillor Stephanie Eaton, **SECONDED** by Councillor Azizur Rahman Khan – "That the motion be amended as per the tabled motion from Councillor Eaton (attached at Appendix C).

The meeting then debated the budget proposals of the Cabinet and the respective amendments moved as above, in accordance with the Budget Council Procedure Rules.

Following debate, Councillor Abjol Miah **MOVED** and Councillor Harun Miah **SECONDED** – "That the question be now put".

On being put to the vote, the procedural motion was **agreed**.

To not pay out the SRA for this post for the remainder of the administration.

To allocate one seat currently occupied by the Labour Party on the Licensing Committee to the Conservative Party.

To allocate one seat currently occupied by the Liberal Democrat Party on the Appeals Committee to the Conservative Party."

The Service Head, Democratic Services confirmed that should it be agreed, the proposed amendment would result in an allocation of committee places that was in accordance with the proportionality regulations.

After debate, Councillor Oliur Rahman **MOVED** and Councillor Joshua Peck **SECONDED** – "That the question be now put." On being put to the vote, the procedural motion was **agreed**.

The tabled amendment moved by Councillor Lutfur Rahman was then put to the vote and was **agreed**.

The substantive recommendations as amended were then put to the vote and were **agreed**. Accordingly it was:

10. Dealing with Labour's £54m black hole:

Accommodation strategy

Given the £1.8m Accommodation strategy overspend, the lease on Anchorage House should not be renewed in two years time, saving £8m per annum.

Shared back office services

Officers should be asked to investigate the possibilities of setting up a shared back office function covering HR, Legal and Finance, the services of which can be sold to other boroughs, RSLs operating in Tower Hamlets and NHS Tower Hamlets. This could lead to sizable cost savings in future years from the existing £5m budget per annum for these items.

11. **200 New Council Homes/Henry Moore sculpture**

The borough owns an original sculpture by Henry Moore, entitled 'Draped Seated Women' which is currently located 200 miles away in Wakefield. The borough should either bring the sculpture back to the borough where it can be enjoyed by all the residents of the borough or it should be sold and the proceeds invested in social housing.

If sold the sculpture could reasonably be expected to fetch many millions. This dowry should be gifted to a local RSL together with the freehold ownership of the Renault showroom on the Commercial Road to build a minimum expected 200 new homes for social-rent, providing 1,000 new bedrooms for the 23,000 on the housing waiting list.

12. Free school meals for all primary and secondary school children in the borough.

Given that Tower Hamlets has the 2nd worst rates of childhood obesity of anywhere in the UK, the LBTH Schools Forum will be asked to agree to fund out of their budget surpluses free school meals for every child in the borough. Currently LBTH schools have £29m of surplus budget that they are holding, of which £9m is unallocated. The cost of providing free school meals from Sept 2010 onwards is circa £6-7m pa.

- 13. That in consequence of the above changes, the budget requirement for 2010/11 be amended to £309,631m
- 14. The remaining amount £738,000 be used to reduce the proposed Council Tax, so that the Council Tax for Tower Hamlets for 2010/11 is £876.77 at Band D, a decrease of 1%.

- 1) In a time of recession, it would be irresponsible and undesirable to raise council tax but with the threat of big cuts in government grant over the next few years it would also be irresponsible to cut council tax at this time
- 2) Nonetheless significant redeployment of resources from communications, including closing East End Life, would allow a boost to apprenticeships at the Olympics site where there has been a chronic lack of employment of Tower Hamlets residents and to raise the threshold for free school meals to improve healthy eating and combat obesity
- 3) The modest realisation of assets would allow for the pedestrianisation of Brick Lane making it more attractive to residents and tourists and boosting income to the borough and provide toilets for the Brick Lane market
- 4) There is the looming massive hole in the council's budget from the financial next year, currently estimated to be as high as £18 million in 2011/2012
- 5) There need to be urgent steps to boost and secure funding for the council's essential public service spending including, boosting the revenue base for the council needs by lifting the council tax cap on the highest value properties and making the council tax more progressive and related to ability to pay, returning control over the business rates to the council, lifting controls over the council borrowing to invest, boosting central government funding through a Robin Hood Tax, and by the council taking a pro-active role in encouraging foreign direct investment into socially beneficial projects.

This Council agrees:

The budget proposals recommended by the Cabinet and amends them as set out below;

To pedestrianise Brick Lane at a cost of up to $\pounds 2m$, contingent upon the sale of surplus office accommodation at Underwood Road for a sum estimated at $\pounds 2.5m$.

To utilise the remaining estimated £500,000 from the sale of Underwood Road to fund planned capital expenditure, enabling the equivalent amount of revenue funding to be released on a one-off basis.

To provide £750,000 for the provision of additional Olympics apprenticeships and request officers to negotiate with the Olympic Delivery Authority and other Olympic bodies for a contribution to costs to target a total of 100 additional apprenticeships.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY: COUNCILLOR STEPHANIE EATON SECONDED BY: COUNCILLOR AZIZUR RAHMAN KHAN

This Council recognises:

- 1. That the universal provision of healthy free school meals to our youngest children has great potential to impact positively on children's health, wellbeing, and educational performance in the medium to long term.
- 2. That across the United Kingdom, governments are evaluating the benefits of providing a healthy meal at school for primary school children.
- 3. Evaluations of pilots of free school meals in Scotland and ongoing trials in Durham, Wolverhampton and Newham show that the provision of free school meals at primary school provides pupils with an opportunity to try new foods, and that as a result pupils are asking for healthier options at home.
- 4. The trials have concluded that choosing healthier options is likely to come as a result of children trying and enjoying new foods. Therefore, evidence shows that the trials act as a catalyst for children's willingness to try new foods and healthier foods.
- 5. The trials of free school meals in Scotland had a positive impact on the home environment of pupils. In particular, it had resulted in parents talking about food with their children more often and some parents noted that children were more confident in discussing their food preferences.
- 6. That the children of Tower Hamlets are among the most deprived in the country and suffer from higher than acceptable levels of obesity and related illness.
- 7. That Members from all political groups have expressed concern about child poverty, education, and health of young people in the Borough,
- 8. That free school meals have support from a number of Children's charities including the Child Poverty Action Group support the introduction of a universal provision at primary school.

- 9. That the proposed one year trial of universal provision in Tower Hamlets would evaluate the benefits to all children including benefits for those children whose parents are not currently eligible for free meals.
- 10. That government grants to local authorities are likely to reduce substantially from 2011/12, hence it is essential to establish now the benefits that free school meals to all primary school children.

This Council also notes:

The comments of Roberta Blackman-Woods MP (City of Durham) who stated last year

"For those who are not yet convinced of the benefits of free school meals - I am sure there are not many out there - I shall highlight a few of them. Throughout the pilot areas, children in our primary schools are receiving a hot, nutritious, free school meal at lunch time. Take-up is high. In addition to the nutritional benefits, and there are many, there is no longer any stigma in taking a free school meal, because all children have them. Even though the pilot has been running for only a few weeks, teachers are already reporting better concentration levels among pupils in the afternoon. The economic benefits of free school meals are substantial for parents. That has been particularly important because the project has been launched in a period of economic downturn. Not having to pay for their children's school meals saves parents £8.50 a week per child. Many local parents have told me that the pilot has made all the difference to their family weathering the recession. Many families with two children in primary school are saving £633 a year.

Much of the food is sourced locally, so local businesses and farmers are also benefiting from the programme and, as I said, additional jobs have been created. We are all terribly concerned about climate change, so we should note that food miles are also being cut, with enormous environmental benefits. Lastly, children are learning social skills and how to eat healthily, which will hopefully help us to tackle obesity in future."
