EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 'Girls Talk' Project was previously funded through Home Office, Communities Against Crime Innovation Fund.

The need for the project was established through research and prior work undertaken by Da'watul Islam UK & Eire, who have amassed considerable experience in tackling this difficult and complex subject.

The project achieved positive outcomes and engaged a large number of girls through their innovative and proven method of effective engagement through partnerships with a number of the borough's secondary schools.

The new project will be refined and enhanced and will incorporate the experiences and lesson learned from the previous project, and will redesign an improved capacity building training course, which will be accredited.

The 'Girl's Talk' project is conceived and designed to directly engage girls and young women who are susceptible to being influenced by gang-type behaviour within environments such as schools and youth clubs and are vulnerable to becoming involved with gangs outside of school/youth clubs.

The project's overall outcome is to reduce/prevent the increase of girls being involved in gang culture. It seeks to educate and build awareness amongst girls of the negative impact of gang culture, its consequences and associated dangers.

As this has been a successful pilot which links closely with the Mayors Priorities on youth support and crime and antisocial behaviour reduction and as the original source of funding has come to an end it is proposed that grant funding be approved for a further year to support the project through the Council's Mainstream Grants Programme. The annual cost of the project is £40k.

The funding will be conditional on it being drawn down against a detailed project plan and binding legal agreement with the Council and it being set against the evidenced delivery outputs and outcomes contained therein and that these agreements are in place before any funds are released. The above being subject to any clarifications from the applicants considered necessary by the Council to further establish value for money, measurable outputs and outcomes and any necessary referral pathway protocols or other requirements specific to safeguarding.

The programme will be monitored through the Council's internal MSG processes.

The Corporate Grants Programme Board agreed on 11th June 2013 to recommend to the Mayor that the Girls Talk Project, run by Da'watul Islam, proposal be granted £40k of MSG funding.
