Hi,

I understand that the Lighthouse Pub's licence is to be considered for review. I would certainly support a full review on the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and prevention of public nuisance.

On the night of 6th May, we were subjected to loud music all night long from the Lighthouse. The pub has no sound proofing ( or didn't at that time) and so the constant opening and closing of the doors made it even worse. Patrons were drinking in the street, shouting loudly and I could hear a disturbance at about 6am on the morning of 7th. When I later looked out the window and saw a car with its windows broken, being towed away, I had good reason to believe that this was the result of the altercation.

I later walked to the bus stop just beyond the Lighthouse to go into the West End. I was unable to walk on the pavement as there were so many people standing and drinking; in fact, I saw one woman, staggering in the road, drink in hand, holding up all the traffic. Needless to say there was still a lot of shouting and drinking at about 0830. The music continued until approx 11am on 7th.

Today, the Lighthouse has cordoned off Iceland Road with railings and is preventing people from driving into the street to park. I am not aware that they have permission to close the street to vehicular traffic. There are cars and vans parked all over the place and people stood outside drinking.
