- 3.0 Background
- 3.1 This is an application for a temporary Event Notice
- 3.2 Enclosed is a copy of the application. (See Appendix 1).
- 3.3 The applicant has described the nature of the application as follows:
 - The supply of alcohol
 - Regulated Entertainment
- 3.4 The premises that has been applied for is:
 The Old Distillery, 33-35 Commercial Road, E1 1LD
- 3.5 The dates that have been applied for are as follows: **4**th **September to 5**th **September 2010**
- 3.6 The times that have been applied for are as follows: 22:00 to midnight on 4th
 Midnight to 05:00 on 5th
- 3.7 A map showing the relevant premises and immediate area is included as **Appendix 2**.

4.0 Temporary Event Notices

- 4.1 Temporary event notices (TENs) are a creation of the Licensing Act 2003. They provide a method by which licensable activities can be carried out on a temporary basis (max. 96 hrs) without a licence. The maximum number that can attend at any one time is 499. At least 10 full working days notice must be given to the licensing authority. When a TEN cannot be obtained, for example the event is over 499, then a full premises licence must be obtained, for a limited duration.
- 4.2 The licensing authority cannot oppose an application, (nor can local residents or businesses. The licensing authority must reject any application that does not meet the rules as to numbers, maximum per year etc. The only responsible authority that can object is the Metropolitan Police.
- 4.3 The police can only object on the grounds that allowing the event to go ahead will undermine the crime prevention objective.
- 4.4 No conditions can be attached to a TEN.

5.0 Objections

5.1 The Police objections are contained in **Appendix 3**.

6.0 Advice to Members

- 6.1 This hearing is required by the Licensing Act 2003. As always the decision is on the civil burden of proof, i.e. the balance of probability.
- 6.2 Members can only consider the crime prevention objective. All other matters must be dealt with elsewhere by primary legislation.
- 6.3 An attempt to widen the grounds of objection to include all the licensing objectives(not just the crime prevention objective) and to extend it to interested parties and responsible authorities was resisted by the Government at the committee stage in the House of Lords. Lord McIntosh, a Government spokesman, stated (HL Deb, vol643,col390, 17 January 2003):

 Is that what we want for school fêtes, weddings, church fundraisers and discos in the village hall? Why should people be asked to jump through additional hoops? There is no need to expand the number of bodies needed to scrutinise temporary event notices. There is no need to widen

the grounds. As long as the Police are satisfied with the proposals and they meet the appropriate conditions on permitted limits, there should be



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

I write with reference to the TEN application which were received in this office on the 22nd July 2010.

Please accept this letter as notification that the police as a responsible authority wish to object to this application on the following licensing objective

The prevention of crime and disorder

The venue is part of a large warehouse owned by Kundra properties. It is with regret that I have to say that although we have pointed out to Mr Rajiv Kundra the number of unlicensed clubs and events occurring in his property, he has taken no action.

This is the first time I have heard of 33-35 Commercial Road described as "The Old Distillery". At the time of writing I believe this space is being sub-letted to a man known to this licensing office.

He denies putting on any "promoted parties" and says he uses it as an arts space. However there was a warehouse party advertised on the internet for 17th July 2010 at 33-35 Commercial Road. It was promoted as "Mould" and it was £3 on entry.

I attended this venue at midday on 19th March 2010 along with LBTH Licensing, Smoking team and EH. Also present was Mr Rajiv Kundra. The venue has a couple of fairly large rooms on the ground floor and then you can go downstairs to a basement area which has in the past been used for a bar. There are other rooms off of this which are maintenance type rooms.

I believe it doesn't have planning permission for such entertainment or that there has been any input from the LFB .In the worst case scenario, if there was a fire, it would be very difficult to evacuate the basement area without any casualties.

At the time of writing I have not spoken to the applicant but received a message on my answer phone. I am unsure if they know that this premise has not been risk assessed or whether there has been permission by the Kundra brothers.

I have been unable to ask the following:

How can they assure us that only 480 people will be involved whether as staff or visitors?

Are there any personal licence holders being employed to sell the alcohol?

Are there any SIA staff being employed to deal with any ASB?

What First Aid plans have they in place?

However well behaved a crowd can be in relation to its own event, any small incident can sometimes escalate into disorder.

I cannot rule out the possibility of disorder. Without any reassurances from the applicant, I ask the committee to reject this application
