Dear Residents,

Thank you to everyone that attended the Q&A session on Monday. At the meeting, it was agreed that I would send some more information to clarify the changes that have been agreed with the Licensing Police, and Tower Hamlets Environmental Health, since our licence application was submitted in April 2021.

Opening hours

Alcohol to be served:

Sunday-Thursday until 2300

Friday & Saturday until midnight and we will reduce this further to 2330

We have a licence until 2am on New Years' Eve. There are no other late nights on the licence.

Music; all speakers will have sound limiters set. There will be no speakers outside or near the doors.

Smoking- only 8 smokers are permitted to leave the site at any one time to smoke

Signs will be prominently displayed at both exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.

CCTV - there will be prominent CCTV both inside and outside the premises recording 24 hours

Refuse- There will be no disposal of glass bottles between the hours of 2300 and 0900

There are lots of other conditions on the original licence, but the above timings/conditions supersede those. We have agreements from all the departments at Tower Hamlets for the licence including Police, Environmental health, Fire officer and planning. These were in place before any of the homes at Fish Island Village were built or sold.

We are aware that many local people are very supportive of the licencing applications and our plans for the restaurant, and are sending letters of support to the council. We would hope that anyone who has previously objected to the licence and is now comfortable with the reduced hours would consider withdrawing their objections.
