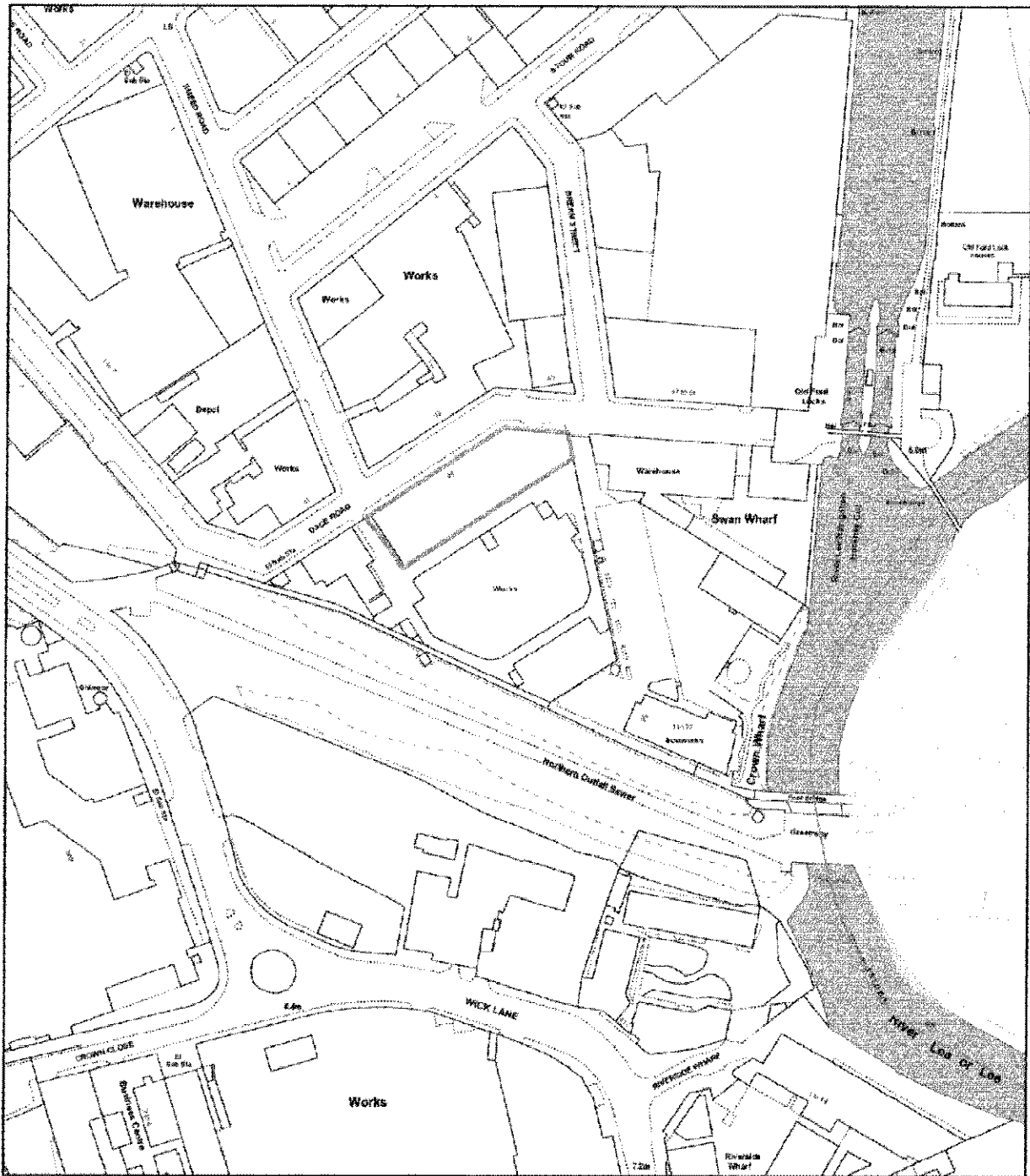

**Re: Application for Temporary Event Notice for 56 Dace Road
on 27th July to the 12th August 2012**

I write with reference to the above application which was received in the Licensing Office on the 17th July 2012.

Police object to the application for a Temporary Event Notice for 56 Dace Road E2 2NQ on the grounds of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance.

56 Dace Road E2 is located in the Fish Island area, which is host to two large venues, namely Swan Wharf and Forman's Field which will be attracting thousands of people. There will also be unprecedented numbers of people in the area due to its proximity to the Olympic site. With the large number of people in the area, the opening of another venue will put additional demands on the local police. Access to Dace Road is going to be very difficult over the Olympic period. Police are concerned that if disorder were to occur that responding to incidents would put undue strain on policing resources given the expected difficulty in accessing the area.

Secondly with any license that is granted Police have to be certain that the applicant can run the venue competently and safely so that crime and disorder and public nuisance can be minimised. This application was received at very short notice and did not give the Police, London Fire Brigade or other authorities the opportunity to conduct the level of checks that would allow us to work with the applicant in making his application.

With a venue that wants to carry out licensable activities over the Olympics a Time Limited License would have allowed us the time to work with the applicant, and to put in place such conditions that would mitigate any risks. As this application is a series of Temporary Event Notices, adding such conditions on is not allowed under the Licensing Act, and therefore any risks cannot be mitigated.

When contacting the applicant Mr Hill, I asked him why he had not applied for a Time Limited License. Mr Hill replied that he was not responsible for that part of the business, although he admitted that he was the project manager, and as such had ultimate responsibility for making sure that relevant applications should be made in time.

I then asked him why he needed to sell alcohol given it was a "Family" event. Mr Hill replied that he needed the alcohol license and that he would remove the DJ's and mixing decks from the area, and that he had two SIA security staff.

I then asked Mr Hill why he needed mixing decks and security for a family event. Mr Hill replied that he would drop the DJ's and thought having security was the right thing to do. I explained that I was concerned as to why his risk assessment for this "Family Event" led him to believe that SIA security staff would be needed, and why he had not mentioned the DJ's in his original application.

I arranged to visit Mr Hill on the 18th July with Fire Safety Inspecting Officer Sam Bennett and two police officers from the Olympic Co-ordination team. Upon visiting the venue Mr Hill stated that the barbeque would be in the main entrance, Sam Bennett had concerns about this.

On questioning Mr Hill I became more worried as to his plans for this event and his ability to run it safely. Mr Hill said he wanted 100 people at the venue, yet on the application he stated it was for 60 people. Mr Hill also was vague on what he would do to prevent crime, disorder and public nuisance other than he had security.

Given the lack of clarity or structure in Mr Hill's plans to prevent crime, disorder or public nuisance, the fire safety implications of having a barbeque in the main entrance of a confined space, and the ambiguity in the general operational plans and procedures of the premises, I believe that granting Mr Hill these Temporary Event Notices would lead to increased crime and disorder and public nuisance.

In an attached statement in support of this objection, Police Commander Johnson states that ***"It is essential that any application for a new licence, an extension to an existing licence or a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) clearly shows how it promotes the licensing objectives, particularly those of preventing crime and disorder and promoting public safety"***.

This application fails to clearly show how it would promote the licensing objectives.

I also include a supporting statement from Fire Safety Inspecting Officer Sam Bennett, who I intend to call as a witness in support of my objection.

I therefore strongly object to the Temporary Event Notice being granted to 56 Dace Road.

I am a Commander in the Metropolitan Police Service, and have been a police officer since 1980. I have served all over London, including postings as the borough commander at Redbridge and Newham. Over the past 32 years I have been involved in public order policing, and in 2007 I became the OCU Commander of the Territorial Support Group. I have commanded many high profile public order events over the years including football matches, demonstrations and have been the Silver Commander for the Notting Hill Carnival for the past 5 years. My role at the moment is as the Silver Commander for the Olympics. This means that I have overall responsibility for policing the Olympic and Paralympic Games in London, and ensuring that London is safe for all visitors and residents in the capital.

The Olympic and Paralympic Games presents the largest peacetime challenge that the Police service will have to deal with. The Games period extends over the summer of 2012 and the GLA anticipate that between 15th July and 16th September an extra 5 million visitors will be coming to London. On peak days there will be up to 150 events taking place, simultaneously, across London. This includes not only the Olympic Games events themselves but also parallel, or associated, events and the regular, local events.

With an estimated world wide television audience of 4 Billion people, London will be the focus of world attention providing unrivalled opportunities for any individual or organisation seeking publicity. This additional demand is set against the backdrop of Global austerity and the current International terrorist threat which is assessed as Substantial. A terrorist attack is a strong possibility; crowded places including bars, pubs and nightclubs may feature in the attack plans of terrorist organisations as they afford the potential for mass fatalities and casualties.

Within this context it is necessary for the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) to maintain its usual activity while tackling the additional opportunities for crime and disorder that are presented by the significant number of visitors, and the additional activity that is going on in London. To ensure that the MPS is able to maintain the peace, prevent and detect crime and protect life and property during this time we will be deploying up to 9000 officers, per day, across London.

This number of officers includes 2,500 brought into London from other forces across the country on mutual aid. This complex operation presents a significant challenge to the MPS but is essential in order to minimise disruption to London and ensure we are able to work together with event organisers, participants and other agencies to deliver a safe and secure games, in keeping with the Olympic culture & spirit, while maintaining 'business as usual' for Londoners and London business.

Any additional burden on resources during this time will compromise our ability to achieve these objectives. Consequently, it is essential that any application for a new licence, an extension to an existing licence or a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) clearly shows how it promotes the licensing objectives, particularly those of preventing crime and disorder and promoting public safety. We will carefully scrutinise all applications to ensure this is done and consider the use of conditions, or objections, where we consider it necessary to achieve these objectives.

Premises: The Pit, Britannia Works, Dace Road, London

With reference to your recent request for advice and the visit made to the above-mentioned premises, I confirm the advice you were given as follows:-

It is in my opinion that under the current circumstances, the barbecue could create a fire risk in the opening of the main entrance to the premises. On inspecting the rear of the premises, the secondary escape route was not suitable and sufficient for the capacity that was stated. The rear of the premises did also not appear to be suitable for children, with uneven ground, trip hazards, disused cylinders and parked cars.
