Licensing Application 121-123 Poplar High Street E14

We, the undersigned residents of Woodstock Terrace and adjacent streets, write this petition to object to the Licensing Application submitted by Lions Express for premises located at 121-123 Poplar High Street E14, on the following grounds:

1. **Prevention of nuisance:** We are extremely concerned about the evening opening hours to midnight and to 1 a.m. These premises border on, are below, opposite and within close proximity to high density residential accommodation within a conservation area. They are located in an area where there is currently no other retail activity taking place during these hours. The opening hours will encourage noise with pedestrians, vehicles and/or taxis going to and from the premises, litter and increased traffic. Additional parking from customers in an already overcrowded restricted Residents Parking area will further inconvenience local residents in the evening. More late activity, potential disturbances and noise into the early hours of the morning will disrupt children's and adults' sleep.
2. **Public Safety:** Corporate companies managing license premise are required to have a wide range of measures in place e.g. CCTV, staff training on the responsible sale of alcohol, under-age ID checks and security to manage and minimise alcohol misuse. Small outlets do not have the same resources, financial and human, to operate in this way. Alcohol misuse remains an area of concern borough-wide.
3. **Prevention of crime and disorder:** Limehouse Area Metropolitan Police Service has prioritised policing for this neighbourhood as a) anti-social behaviour in general b) anti-social behaviour by youths and c) anti-social behaviour related to drug use. There is an on-going problem as the Police and Community safety officers can confirm of street drug dealing in this area. Additional licensed premises in the area could encourage additional undesirable illegal activity related to drugs and drinking in the vicinity.
4. There are plenty of other take-aways, restaurants, public houses and off-sales within walking distance of this location without the need to disturb the peace of an established residential quarter with an additional outlet - particularly one which is open to such late hours including Sunday evening to midnight.
