Re: Application for Temporary Event Notice for Arch 11 Gales Gardens

I write with reference to the above application which was received in the Licensing Office at 11:21pm on Thursday the 22nd January 2015.

Police object the application for a Temporary Event Notice for the 7th and 8th February 2015 on the grounds of Crime and Disorder and Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The venue has come to the notice of both Tower Hamlets Police and Tower Hamlets Council for several illegal Raves that have taken place there in the last year. This has resulted in complaints by local residents.

The venue is right behind a busy local pub, and close to several more, as well as being off a main road and Bethnal Green Tube Station. Police believe that having this event could lead to disorder as the people attending this event will congregate next to the people from the pub, people trying to move down Bethnal Green Road and those using the tube station.

The venue is very small and has only 1 exit, if there were any disorder in the venue it could well lead to injuries as people are trying to leave, or police try to enter.

By having a dance music event that runs from midnight to 06:00 runs the risk that people will attend the event having already pre-loaded on alcohol. Being able to consume alcohol for an additional 6 hours runs the risk of creating alcohol related crime and disorder.

Such events also attract drug use and where there is drug use there are drug dealers who supply them.

Tower Hamlets Police and Environmental Health are working with Network Rail to remove the current occupants due to the illegal events taking place there.

Given that this is not a venue specifically designed to host such events, and that there is the possibility of alcohol related disorder and drug use we therefore object to the Temporary Event Notice being granted and ask that it is refused by committee.

Dear Sir/Madam, please accept this email as a representation to the application for a TEN for Arch 11 Gales Gardens, London, E2 0EJ.

We have received a complaint about a 'Private' event that was held at this address just last week. Loud music from this venue was witnessed in a complainants property at 02.15 and our Out of Hours Officers had to attend the site and get music levels reduced. The officer stated that customers were seen leaving Arch 12 and entering Arch 11. We have had several issues with Arch 12 last year with illegal events taking place, to the point that we are now in discussions with the owner of both of these arches and at the point of taking legal action against both the tenants and owners.

It is my understanding that S.80 Noise Abatement Notices (Environmental Protection Act 1990) will be served on the appropriate parties next week.

The officer spoke with a male whom I had only spoken to two weeks ago and advised of the history of these units and that if he continued to have these type of events we would consider further action. He failed to mention during that phone call that he would be having this type of event on this date. This person is not the applicant in this instance. I have attached a photograph taken by the officer on the night.

This venue is not suitable for an electronic music event until 06.00 over two days, there are residential properties within 20m of this site. The venue does not have a Premises Licence, so no conditions can be imposed to safeguard a peaceful right to sleep in one's home.

We are currently undertaking work to stop any further events at these railway arches as they are a source of noise disturbance and anti-social behaviour.

It is then our opinion that this application be rejected on the grounds of not promoting the Licensing objective of Prevention of Public Nuisance.
