BACKGROUND

DECISION:

On 4th February 2015 Cabinet authorised the sale, by informal tender, of five council owned properties, being 11-31 Toynbee Street, 2 Jubilee Street, 31 Turner Street, 329 Morville Street and 296 Bethnal Green Road. The report however recommended that 296 Bethnal Green Road should be sold by auction rather than informal tender for a number of reasons as set out within

the report. Following that decision by Cabinet in February, 2015 the Executive on the 27th April, 2015:

- A. Agreed the sale of 296 Bethnal Green Road by auction; and
- B. Noted that following a direction given by the Secretary of State on 17th December 2014, prior written agreement will be required from appointed Cornmissioners before disposing of the property.

REASONS FOR THE REFERENCE BACK

The Call-in requisition in relation to the above decision on the Executive on 27th April, 2015 set out the following reasons for the call-in:-

- 1. Until the election of a new mayor, Executive decisions should have been paused in order to ensure legitimacy and accountability of any decisions made. That then Deputy Mayor had no democratic mandate to a decision over 296 Bethnal Green Road.
- The disposal of assets such as 296 Bethnal Green Road during a
 period of uncertainty over governance issues namely the removal of
 the Executive Mayor from office would have benefitted from full
 scrutiny in a cross-party arena and that consideration by the Overview
 and Scrutiny Committee would have provided such scrutiny and
 examination.
- The disposal of assets was a decision for the Department for Communities and Local Government's appointed Commissioners.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION RECOMMENDED BY THE OVERVIEW AND SCRUTINY COMMITTEE (IF ANY)

The Call-in requisition proposed the following alternative action in relation to the Mayor's decision:-

- I. That this Executive decision should be reversed; and
- II. That there should be a moratorium on decision making (decisions made unilaterally by the Deputy Mayor) until the election of the new Mayor.
