As a resident of Tower amlets living near to the venue, I believe the granting of the permanent licence will have ero impact on bringing crime, disorder or public nuisance to the local area, nor do I believe it will impact public safety in a negative way. Instead, I feel the full-time operation of the outdoor space will bring far more positive things to our community, providing us with a place to regularly enjoy a socially-distanced pub garden experience, something which, up until now, has been hard to come by in Wapping.
