Background

There is a need to understand and better coordinate these activities to strengthen this work, avoid duplication and identify specific gaps in provision

Key themes



- Four barriers to digital inclusion
 - Access (devices and connectivity)
 - Skills
 - Motivation
 - Trust
- Cost
- Those with disabilities, older people, CYP, language
- Importance of family and friends
- Individual needs differ – no one size fits all
- Everchanging context with technology and need evolving



Emerging Actions – Access to devices and connectivity



- Working with internet providers on social value offer
- Promoting 'affordable' connectivity
- Mapping and promoting free internet access / access to devices across TH
- Strategies for repurposing and recycling devices across TH
- Promoting funding for devices and connectivity
- Creating best practice guidance on gifting/loaning devices



Emerging Actions – Skills, Motivation and Trust



- Employers digitally upskilling staff
- Developing borough-wide best practice on skills provision, integrated into other courses, combining resources, etc
- Targeting work to understand and address skills need amongst those with disabilities
- Developing safeguarding awareness
- Developing and maximising ‘digital buddy’ schemes linking with volunteering opportunities
- Creating a fixed-term, borough-wide ‘Digital Ambassador’ role to champion, co-ordinate and drive work forward
