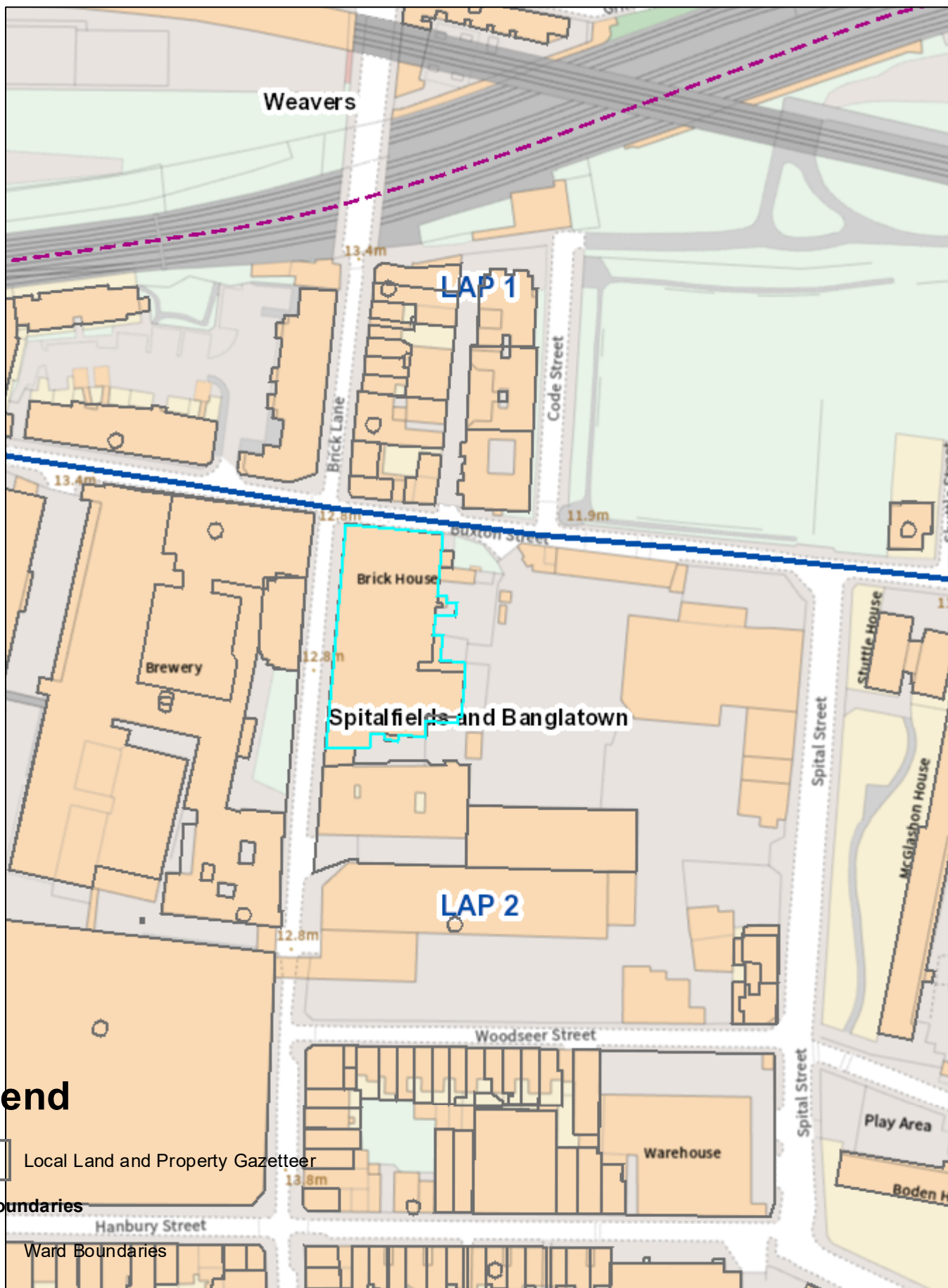

## **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

1.

- (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on;
    - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

**Effective from 10<sup>th</sup> October 2010:**

4.
  - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
5. The responsible person shall ensure that;
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

## **Door supervisors**

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, such individuals must be licensed with the Security Industry Authority. This does not apply to premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001, (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or in respect of premises in relation to-

- any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of Schedule 2 (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of Schedule 2 (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act) unless the Licence specifically states otherwise.

Security activity means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of Schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 of that schedule applies, and Paragraph 8(5) of Schedule 2 (interpreting of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of Schedule 2 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001

## **Films**

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

1. No nudity or semi nudity permitted.
2. Signs are to be prominently displayed inside and outside the premises warning customers that drug use on the premises will not be tolerated, there will be random searching on entry and the police may be called if drugs are found.
3. To support the written search policy at the premises, a secure drugs box is to be installed at the premises. Any confiscated items that are, or are

believed to be drugs, are to be placed into this box. Any such seizures are to be entered into a drug seizures log, which is to be kept in a safe place. This log will record the following details

- a) Time/ date and location of the seizure.
  - b) Member of staff seizing the item.
  - c) Name or description of the customer from whom the item was seized.
4. The management of the premises will contact the Police at least once every calendar month, for an officer to attend the premises, empty the drugs box, and sign the drugs log accordingly.
  5. Any customer or member of staff found using or supplying illegal drugs (of whatever quantity) on the premises is to be permanently excluded from the premises. Any customer or member of staff found possessing or supplying illegal drugs (of whatever quantity) on the premises is to be permanently excluded from the premises if the management of the Premises acting reasonably considers this prudent, and if the management of the Premises has any doubts about this they should consult the Police. A record of such exclusions is to be entered into the incident book. All reasonable steps must be taken to ensure all staff (including door staff) are aware of the identity of excluded persons.
  6. No person shall be allowed to leave the premises whilst in the possession of any open glass vessel, whether empty or containing any beverage. Bottle bins shall be provided at the exit doors and staff shall prevent glass bottles and glass glasses being taken from the premises
  7. An Incident Register shall be kept at the premises. This register will be maintained and kept for a minimum of 12 months. This register should record the following;
    - a) Name of the person responsible for the premises on each given day.
    - b) All incidents in relation to the use of force by staff or Door Supervisors in the removal of persons from the premises. It shall record the time and date of the occurrence, name or brief description of the person removed, and details of the staff involved.
    - c) Door Supervisors shall enter their full details at the commencement of work (full name, home address and contact telephone number, SIA registration number and the time they commenced and concluded working). If the Door Supervisor was supplied by an agency, details of that agency will also be recorded including the name of the agency, the registered business address and a contact telephone number.
  8. The premises will have door supervisors of both sexes on duty at all times when the management reasonably believe this to be necessary taking into account specifically the day of the week and the number of customers

expected to attend the premises on any particular day. All Door Supervisors working outside the premises or whilst engaged in the dispersal of patrons at the close of business shall wear 'High Visibility Clothing'.

9. All management staff shall be trained in dealing with persons who are incapacitated through the use of drugs or the combined effect of drugs and alcohol.
10. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.
11. All members of staff at the premises shall seek "credible photographic proof of age evidence" from any person who appears to be under the age of 18 years and who is seeking to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises. Such credible evidence shall be in the form of a passport or photographic driving licence. The premises shall be permitted to occasionally run specific events where persons under the age of 18 are permitted on the premises - such events will be for persons under the age of 18 only and there shall be no alcohol sold at these events. The premises shall provide the police with two weeks notice in advance that such an event is taking place.
12. The Licence Holder shall implement a written dispersal policy, to move customers from the premises and the immediate vicinity in such a way as to cause minimum disturbance or nuisance to neighbours. The policy shall be approved in writing by the Tower Hamlets Licensing Police.
13. A CCTV system shall be installed or the existing system maintained covering the inside and outside areas of the premises. The system will incorporate a camera covering each of the entrance doors and be capable of providing an image that is regarded as 'identification standard.'
  - a) To obtain a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises on the CCTV system, persons entering the premises should be asked to remove headwear which obscures the person's face, unless worn as part of religious observance.
  - b) CCTV is to comply with the Data Protection Act 1998 and is to be working and recording correctly when the premises are open to the public.
  - c) The CCTV system shall incorporate a recording facility and any recordings shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of one calendar month. A system shall be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image. The system will comply with other essential legislation, and all signs as required will be clearly displayed. The system will be maintained and fully operational

throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity.

- d) The positions of all CCTV cameras shall be agreed with the Police Crime Prevention officer for the area, and any subsequent changes must be discussed with the Police Crime Prevention Team beforehand.
  - e) A staff member from the premises that is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be on the premises at all times that the premises is open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
14. Where external promoters are to be used for running events in the premises then Police risk assessment forms (Form 696) are to be fully completed before the event and emailed to the relevant police units, so that artists, DJ's, MC's and promoters can be checked. The forms will be completed and returned to the required police addresses electronically at least 2 weeks prior to the event taking place. A post event form will also be completed (F696a) and returned to the required police addresses. The management should act on police advice in response to such risk assessment forms.
15. Direct telephone access to reputable local taxi company shall be available for use by patrons.
16. A Designated Premises Supervisor, Personal Licence Holder or Nominated person to be on the premises at all times.
17. Persons under the age of 18 shall not be permitted on the premises after 19.30hrs.

- 19 a) There shall be one SIA accredited security guard on duty for every 45 customers in the premises.
- b) A comprehensive and stand-alone Drugs Policy for the premises must be produced, adopted and reviewed annually by the Designated Premises Supervisor.

c) A “Challenge 21” policy must be adapted at the premises, under which any person purchasing or attempting to purchase alcohol who appears to be under 21 will be asked for photographic ID as proof of their age.

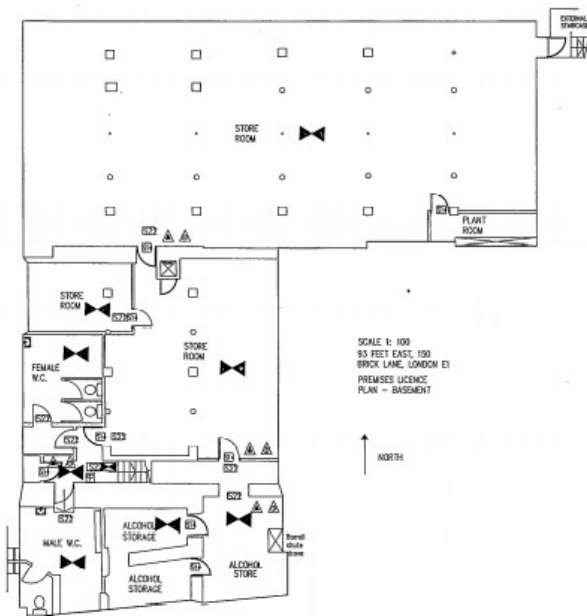
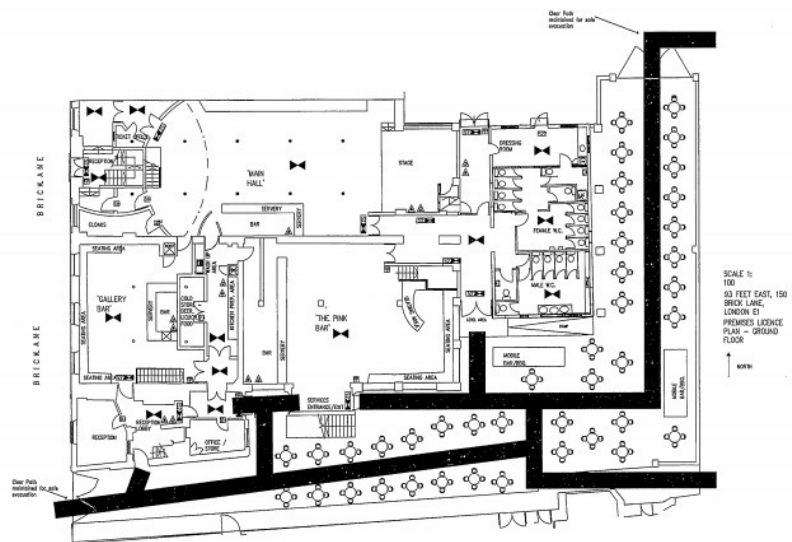
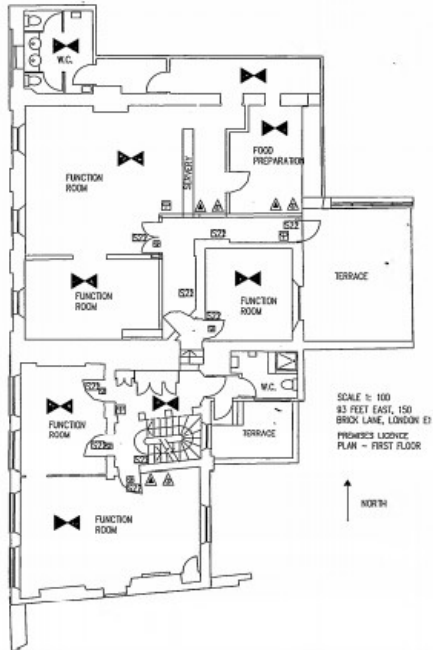
