
### Overview of programme

- 17 Schemes across the borough were proposed
- 7 live schemes
  - Bethnal Green
  - Bow
  - Wapping
  - Barkantine
  - Brick Lane
  - Old Ford Road West
  - Shadwell



# **Consultation approach**

- Consultation with strategic stakeholders such as TfL and emergency services.
- All schemes included two codesign workshops with stakeholders & residents.


- Engagement with local stakeholder including residents, ward councillors, business, TRAs and disability groups
- Over 50,000 scheme leaflets and surveys sent
- Over 9000 responses

# Scheme delivery progress





### Which schemes have been paused for review



• Bow Bus Gate/Skew Bridge Closures: There are concerns from TfL that diverted traffic could have adverse impacts on the wider road network and particularly bus journey times. Modelling is required to verify impacts and allow for the design of mitigation impacts

• Future Liveable Street Projects: the remaining 10 projects have been paused while the other elements of the programme are underway



### Barkantine




### Scheme is near completion

- Widened footways one Alpha Grove
- Raised junctions on Alpha Grove
- Greening on Mellish Street
- Bay removals to allows turning movements for larger vehicles

### **Lessons learnt**



### Need for a new consultation approach:

- Feedback has shown that there is a perception from sections of the community that the project is led by a team of external consultants.
- This has led to a lack of trust in the consultation and engagement process from certain section of the community.
- Council officers now take more of a front facing role for all consultations



### **Lessons learnt**



### A new consultation methodology:

- There is a need to develop a bespoke consultation approach less reliant on online responses and mailed out surveys. This has been difficult during the pandemic.
- Support/opposition of schemes needs to be captured in a more face to face way to address digital exclusion concerns. E.g. we are undertaking onsite hotspot surveys to complement online surveys for Shadwell and Brick Lane.
- Survey design needs to be simplified to make it more accessible, e.g. less text and limited use of jargon.
- Systems need to be in place to address potential abuse of online responses from interest groups. Responses in opposition and support were received from other parts of the UK.

# TOWER HAMLETS

#### Greater use on internal resource for project management and design:

- Much of the project management and design of the first three schemes was outsourced to external
  consultants, due to the lack of internal capacity.
- An internal restructure of the Highways service has increased capacity for design and delivery to be led by internal council teams.
- More use of internal resource has reduced project costs.
- Old Ford Road West and most of Bow and Brick Lane schemes are now delivered in house by council designers and engineers.

#### The need for a review

- Principle of Liveable Streets with some redesign are still supported.
- Questions have arisen from some journeys for residents being unreasonably lengthened.
