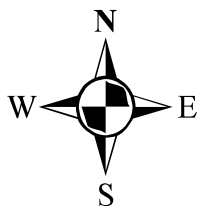

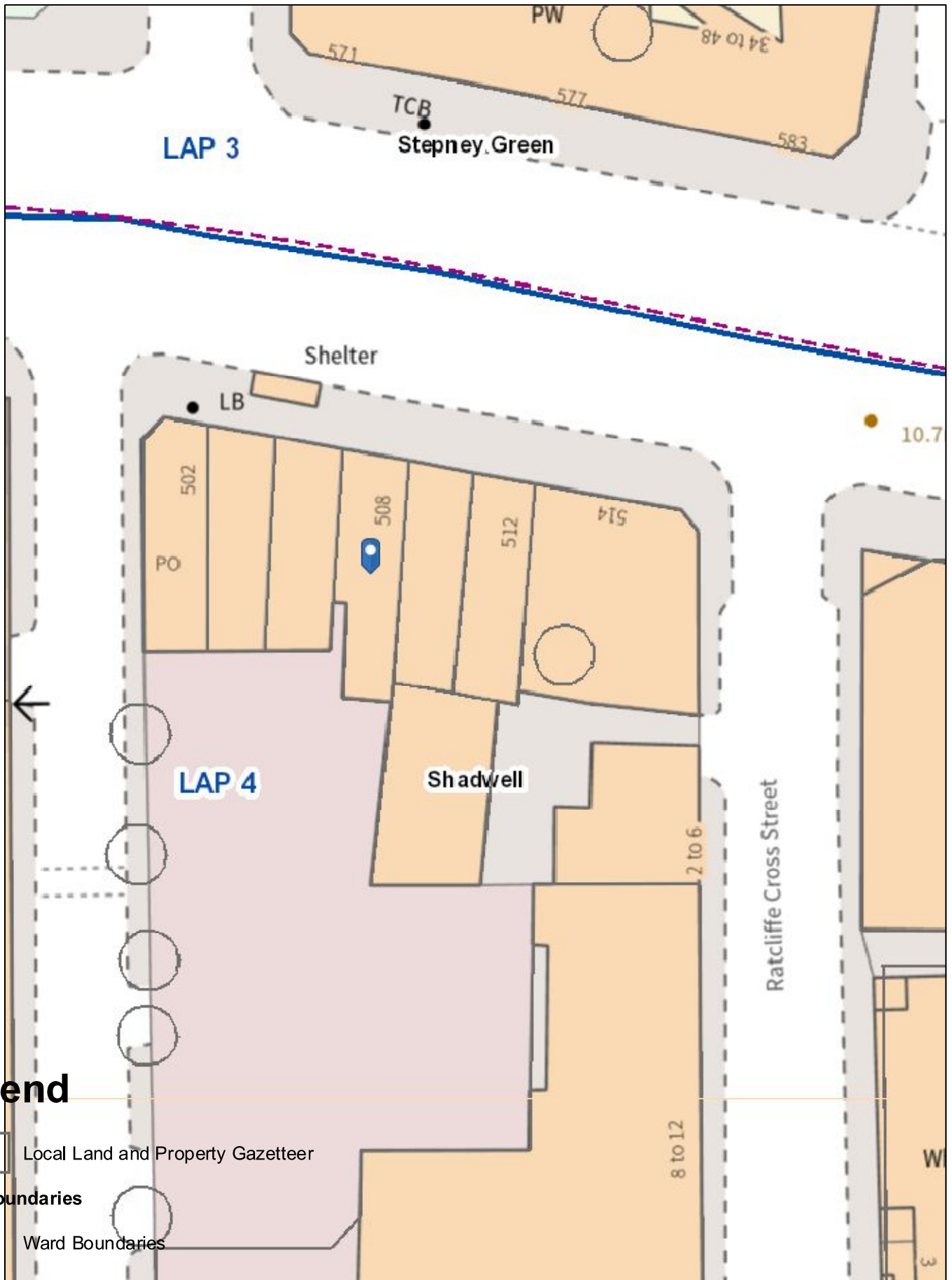

Local Land and Property Gazetteer

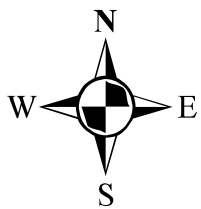

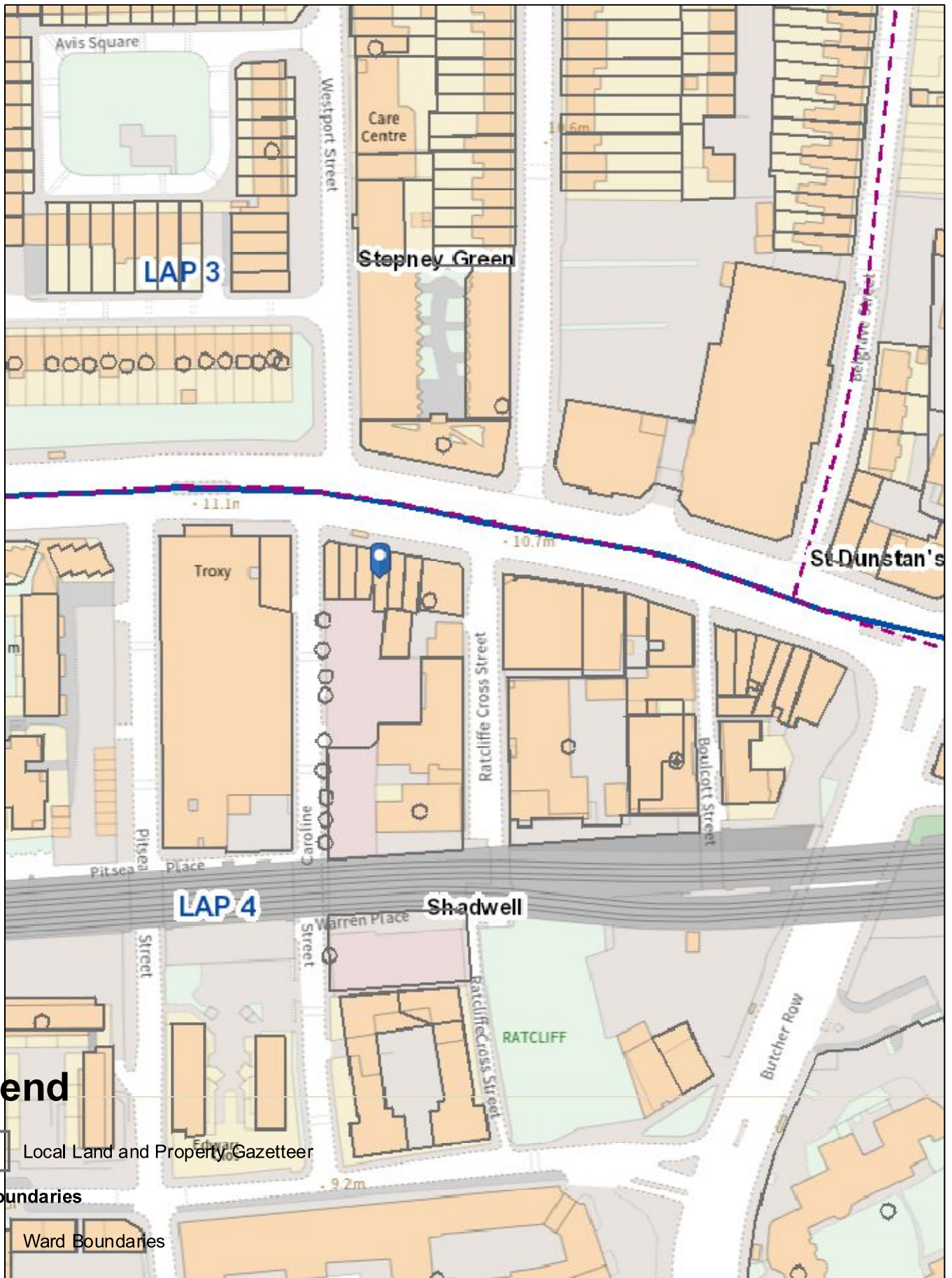

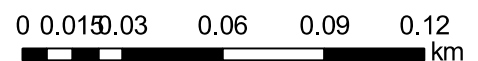

- a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

OFF SALES ONLY

3.

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

5. 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula —

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
 where —
 - (i) **P** is the permitted price
 - (ii) **D** is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

1. A refusal book will be maintained and details of refusals of sales will be entered and made available to the police and local authorities upon request. Details of time, date, staff member and reason for refusal must be recorded.
2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately upon request by an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a. All crimes reported to the venue;
 - b. all ejections of patrons;
 - c. any incidents of disorder;
 - d. any faults in the CCTV system;
 - e. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
3. The Premise Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that all staff shall receive refresher training twice a year in accordance with training materials relating to the 'Challenge 25' policy which shall be in force at the premises. All staff training shall be recorded and made available if requested by the Police or any authorised person This is to be documented in such a way that it can be given to an authorised officer on request. Staff should also sign and document confirming the training has taken place and the date.
4. In the event that crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:
 - a. The police and, where appropriate, Ambulance Service, are called immediately.
 - b. As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to apprehend any identified suspects pending the arrival of the police.
 - c. As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to preserve any identified crime scene pending the arrival of the police.
 - d. Any and all appropriate measures are taken to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises at all times during operating hours.
5. Appropriate digital CCTV equipment and a sufficient number of cameras shall be installed and maintained at the premises to record colour images that are clear enough to allow the Police to use them to investigate any crimes that are committed on the premises. The areas covered by the cameras will be all areas that the public have access and this will include the outside area. A camera will be positioned to obtain images of persons entering the building by the main entrances.

6. Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) system to be installed at the premises ensuring the following:
 - a. It is maintained in good working order and faults are repaired without delay.
 - b. All entry and exit points must be covered to enable frontal identification of every person entering the premises in any light condition.
 - c. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during times when customers remain on the premises.
 - d. A minimum of 2 notices stating that CCTV is in operation shall be displayed throughout the premises where the public have access. The notices shall be at least A4 size.
 - e. The CCTV shall cover clearly any area where alcohol is on display.
 - f. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
 - g. DPS and other key staff will be trained in the use of the CCTV system and shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public and the DPS and other key staff must be able to show or supply if requested by a Police or authorised officer.
 - h. No persons other than the Police, the licensing authority, the premise licensing holder or the managers/DPS shall have access to the CCTV recording equipment or the recordings made from such equipment.
 - i. If an incident occurs at the premises then the footage on the CCTV system shall be made available to view by Police officers on request. If a copy is requested then it must be available within 24 hours of the request.
7. Customers will be reminded by way of a notice at the entrance/ exit door to please leave the premises quietly and have consideration for the neighbouring properties. This will include an instruction that no loitering is permitted outside the premises, once a purchase is made.
8. The management shall adopt the "Challenge 25" policy. Any person who appears to look under the age of 25 years shall be challenged and asked for identification to prove that they are over the age of 18 in accordance with the 'Challenge 25' policy.
9. The premises will only accept valid forms of identification such as photo driving licence, passport and home office approved id cards displaying the national proof of age standard scheme (PASS hologram). All customers who look under the age of 25 shall be challenged to prove their age and identity when purchasing alcohol.
10. Signs will be displayed informing customers that a Challenge 25 policy is in operation at the premises.

11. The sale of alcohol will be refused if a member of staff (or driver, for delivery) believes the alcohol is being purchased on behalf of another person aged under 18 years.

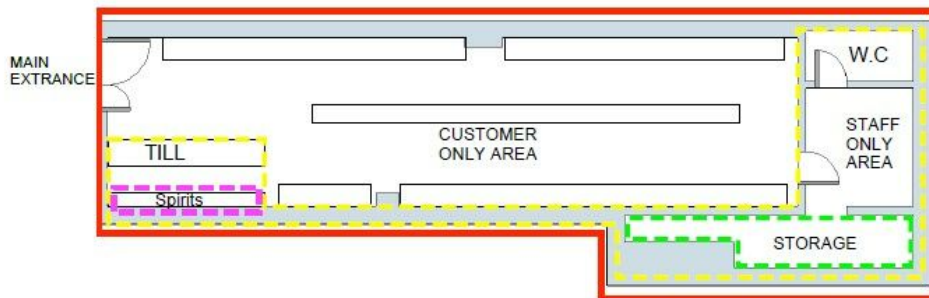

Dear Sir,

Central East Police Licensing formally object to the application for the Temporary Event Notice for Spirits of East, 508 Commercial Road E1 0HY, from midnight to 5:59am over the period 26th December 2022 to 1st January 2023 for the sale of alcohol. The objection is on the grounds of both preventing crime and disorder and public nuisance.

The applicant has stated that they want to be open to be able to sell alcohol to those attending events in the local area.

The concern we have is that by selling alcohol at the times requested by the applicant, the vast majority of the customers who will be purchasing alcohol will be those who have already attended pubs, clubs, parties and events and consumed alcohol, and wish to purchase more alcohol as they move to other events or make their way home.

The applicant's venue is close to the Troxy, a venue that has many late night shows and events around Christmas and New Year period. By selling alcohol to those who have partied at the Troxy there is a heightened risk that drunk people will be sold alcohol, who will then go on to cause, or be involved in alcohol related crime and disorder once they have left the premises.

There is an increased risk that these customers purchasing alcohol in the early hours of the morning are more likely to already be intoxicated, and supplying them with more alcohol will only increase the risk that they will become vulnerable. People who are intoxicated also have an impaired decision making processes and are more likely to be either the victims of, or instigators of alcohol related crime and disorder.

Intoxicated people are more likely to have raised voices and less concern for residents living nearby. The applicant's venue is very close to large numbers of residential properties, whose occupants are likely to be disturbed as people consume the alcohol they have purchased or wait to be served.

For the above reasons we believe that the TEN will lead to crime and disorder and public nuisance, and we therefore ask that the application is rejected.

Good afternoon Licensing,

I have regarded the application for the TENs for Spirits of East 508 Commercial Road, London and the potential impact of public nuisance and measures to prevent noise generated from within the premises or outside it which could cause disturbance to people in the vicinity the proposed hours are well beyond the existing hours of the licence

The existing hours of the premises for licensable activities: sale by retail of alcohol;

- **Sunday to Thursday 0600 hours to 2330 hours; and**
- **Friday & Saturday 0600 hours to midnight.**

The applicant is proposing licensable activities: sale by retail of alcohol;

- **Monday 26th December to Thursday 29th December 2022 & Sunday 1st January 2023 from 23:30 hours to 05.59 hours (extension of 6 hours 29 minutes)**
- **Friday 30th & Saturday 31st January from Midnight until 05:59 hours (extension of 5 hours 59 minutes)**

Noise Sensitive premises: residential and commercial premises in close proximity to 508 Commercial Road, London

In my view the application, as it stands fails, to comply with the objective of the Licensing Act 2003 relating to “public nuisance” for the following reasons:-

- Noise breakout from the venue affecting neighbouring residents
- Access & egress to and from the venue, of patrons, especially due to patrons likely to be in high spirits; and
- The hours of operation (inclusive of proposals)

CONCLUSION

Environmental Protection **does not** support the application for Spirits of East 508 Commercial Road, London as there is great likelihood of disturbance to residential premises at the noise sensitive hours sought. I would be willing to consider withdrawing my representation if the applicant reduced the hours request to 01:00 hours, not as proposed 05:50 hours in the morning.
