Primary headlines



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- In primary schools, all outcomes remain above national in the phonics screening check, KS1 (except reading at greater depth – but the gap is closing) and KS2.
- In Reception, children in the LA do not perform as well as national and this gap has increased between 2019 and 2022.
- Disadvantaged pupil continue to outperform disadvantaged pupils nationally in all Key Stages.
- All results in primary, both locally and nationally, have decreased compared to outcomes in 2019 (except for reading at KS2).
- Decreases are similar between LA and national.

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

Current Ofsted grades %: *primary*




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Current Ofsted grades %: *secondary*




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Current Ofsted grades %: *nursery, special, all through*




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Current Ofsted grades %: All schools
