## Conclusions

Offers made to Tower Hamlets secondary schools under the sibling priority have fallen from almost a third to less than a quarter of all offers. As a proportion of all offers this is in line with the neighbouring borough of Newham, where we are now seeing rise in the proportion of sibling offers to a similar level.

The removal of the priority given to the first born or eldest child will not disadvantage those families where priority is determined by distance, as there is still significant choice locally, across a diverse range of school provision.

The parental preferences that this analysis is based on were made the priority for first born or eldest child in place. It is therefore not possible to predict how preference patterns might change where this is removed.
