Feedback from Service Users and their Primary Carers:

- **Long waits to get an appointment.**
- Language issues lead to miscommunications and a sense of feeling misunderstood.

Feedback from Carers and Care Coordinators:

- Long waiting hours to get an appointment works against the carers schedule and does not allow them to fulfill their duty.
- Carers are not regarded as rightful representatives of their clients.

Findings:



Lack of awareness about reasonable adjustments.



Inconsistent implementation of reasonable adjustments and minimal extension of auxiliary services.



The relationship between the carer and the service user is nuanced and can be used to leverage accessibility.



Proposals:

- Communications campaign to raise awareness about resoanble adjustments.
- In-depth research into the implementation of reasonable adjustments in TBTH.
- Supporting and scaling local training programs such as ICM Foundation's Core Projects led by adults with disabilities to encourage reasonable adjustments in healthcare.
