

#### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- a) at a time where there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

1.

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises;
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 3.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider:  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 5. 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
  - 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
    - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
    - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula —

 $P = D + (D \times V)$ 

where —

- (i) **P** is the permitted price
- D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax
  - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day

#### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

- 1. There shall be no off sales
- 2. No drinks shall be taken outside the premises.
- 3. The number of smokers shall be limited to five at any one time.
- 4. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly. Notices restricting the number of smokers to also be displayed at all exits;
- 5. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the LBTH Police Licensing Team.

- a. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.
- b. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises.
- c. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.
- d. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 6. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 7. The Licence Holder shall ensure that the details of all complaints are recorded in an occurrence book and such book shall be available for police inspection.
- 8. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and/or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
- 9. Non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available to patrons throughout the permitted hours for the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 10. No music or amplified sound shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance at the nearest noise sensitive premises.
- 11. Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 12. A dedicated telephone number for the Designated Premises Supervisor or the duty manager shall be maintained for use by any person who may wish to make a complaint and shall be advertised at the premises or on its website.
- 13. The premises shall operate a Challenge 21 Policy.




#### Proposed Conditions

- 1. Notices shall be prominently displayed at any area used for smoking requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and use the area quietly. Notices restricting the number of smokers to also be displayed at all exits;
- 2. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of the LBTH Police Licensing Team.
  - a. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.
  - b. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises.
  - c. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.
  - d. Viewing of recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the entire 31 day period.
- 3. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open. This staff member must be able to provide a Police or authorised council officer copies of recent CCTV images or data with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 4. The Licence Holder shall ensure that the details of all complaints are recorded in an occurrence book and such book shall be available for police inspection.
- 5. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and/or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
- 6. Non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available to patrons throughout the permitted hours for the sale or supply of alcohol.
- 7. No music or amplified sound shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance at the nearest noise sensitive premises.
- 8. Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- 9. A dedicated telephone number for the Designated Premises Supervisor or the duty manager shall be maintained for use by any person who may wish to make a complaint and shall be advertised at the premises or on its website.


- 10. The premises shall operate a Challenge 21 or 25 Policy.
- 11. A minimum of 1 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the premises from 8pm on Fridays and Saturdays until close. They must correctly display their SIA licence(s) when on duty so as to be visible.
- 12. Loudspeakers shall not be located in the entrance and exit of the premises or outside the building.
- 13. On the first and second floor of the premises, the supply of alcohol at the premises shall only be by waiter/waitress service and to a person seated taking a substantial table meal there and for consumption by such a person as ancillary to their meal.
- 14. No collections of waste or recycling materials (including bottles) from the premises shall take place between 11pm and 8am hours on the following day.
- 15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police. It must be completed within 24 hours

of

- a. the incident and will record the following:
- b. all crimes reported to the venue
- c. all ejections of patrons
- d. any complaints received concerning crime and disorder




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

Having looked at this application further I make the following representation under the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance.

Despite taking into consideration the existing shadow licence hours and conditions, plus the agree conditions with the police I am still concerned regarding the 'off sales' of alcohol especially as a previous application requesting off sales was refused by the licensing committee. As you are aware this premises is within the Brick Lane CIA area and therefore the area is already saturated with licensed premises therefore this application could add to the accumulative effect on undermining the licensing objectives.

You state 'off sales' are requested so your client can have outside seating (I note there is no outside seating on the plan) therefore I request the following conditions:

- Off sales of alcohol/consumption of alcohol shall only be consumed by patrons seated at a table within any external seating area belonging to the premises or under a pavement licence.
- 2. All outside tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable by 21:00 hours each day.
- 3. The premises licence holder shall ensure that any patrons drinking and/or smoking outside the premises do so in an orderly manner and are supervised by staff so as to ensure that there is no public nuisance or obstruction of the public highway.

If these conditions are acceptable to your client I am prepared to withdraw my representation.

I write further to my brief response and thank you for your patience here.

I apologise that we did not reply to Nicola's earlier email but Felix is on holiday and returns on Tuesday.

This is an application for a new premises licence.

You are correct that there is a shadow licence in force in the name of the landlord and the premises previously operated, I understand, as Dirty Bones/Les Trois Garcons but that licence has lapsed.

By way of background James Dye and his business partner are behind this venture.

James Dye is a well respected owner operator, Director and entrepreneur in the hospitality industry.

He formerly operated premises in Peckham, South London; at Frank's café (iconic and award winning) the Camberwell Arms and his most recent venture is Bambi in nearby London Fields.

Bambi provides 'great music wine and food in equal measure' (a quote from James himself) and recently featured in the top 30 hottest restaurants in London according to British Vogue.

He therefore sees these closed premises as an opportunity to bring something of this quality back to life.

The concept is broadly as follows:-

- 1. The basement is toilets back of house kitchen etc.
- 2. The ground floor will more be a pub in style but will have good quality food with the introduction of a Rotisserie grill with a focus on French market style rotisserie chicken.
- 3. The first floor is going to be more fine dining restaurant called One Club Row which will be inspired by New York and so will be all about oysters, Martinis, steak tartare and some jazz.
- 4. The second floor has a small private dining room.

In summary, this will be about quality and where possible local food wine beer soft drinks and some live entertainment.

The building is grade two listed and so internal changes must be limited but it would be a shame if this site which is strategically placed on the corner were not trading in some way.

In relation to off sales then James would like the ability to have customers to drink outside and possibly a pavement licence for tables and chairs like the nearby all press and Jolene on or near Club Row.

I do hope that this assists.

I will be in the 'Other persons' criteria for this representation as i live & have lived in for the past 3 years.

I put forward my representation on behalf of the following 3 grounds -

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- the prevention of public nuisance
- public safety

Firstly, I like to talk about grounds of public nuisance.

A nightclub is going to erase our ability to sleep at night. Boxpark is further away from this proposed nightclub. There is about 25-30 people living in this building right beside where this proposed club wants to go. It does not belong here, we are already getting noise pollution from the construction work being done at the opposite end of the road, they are literally working there all day until late evening & on the weekends & plan to do this for at least the next two years. It is NOT fair that the residents of this building will have to be put through even MORE noise pollution. Between Boxpark, construction work & this proposed nightclub we will not be able to sleep.

Secondly, I would like to talk about public safety & crime - there is mostly females living in this building. It is outlandish to say having hundreds of drunk revellers on the street after 2am is going to make any of us feel safe. I do not want to walk home if I am out late & see probably mostly men loitering around the street. It is also away from the main road, therefore if you have lots of drunk people coming out drunk not into public view this will end in violence & increased crime. We all know when people leave a nightclub at 1 or 2am they do not go straight home.

I am flabbergasted & extremely anxious this might potentially go ahead. It is so out of touch with the area to have a nightclub put on this quiet residential street & surrounding areas. We already have Shoreditch House & numerous amount of establishments nearby, there does not to be another place for drunk people to loiter around - this kind of place would be better suited to Shoreditch High Street. Cecconis run a hotel & there is 7 full apartments less than 25m away from this proposed development - please if you have any care or decency think of us & how this will impact our ability to sleep + function in our daily lives before allowing it in.

Hi James,

With regards to the conversation we had earlier. I would request if consideration could be given to add the following conditions to the license as proposed. This is two additions and two amendments. The reason for this is keeping in line with the licensing act 2003, subsequent 182 guidance and the Tower Hamlets Licensing Policy I believe these changes will allow the venue to adhere to the licensing objectives and operate as a responsible license holder:

1- A minimum of 2 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty at the premises from 20:00 hours until close Friday and Saturday. A minimum of 1 SIA licensed door supervisors shall be on duty Thursday directly before a bank holiday Friday and Sunday directly before a bank holiday Monday from 20:00 until close. Additional SIA shall be employed on a risk assessment basis. These risk assessments are to be written and reviewed yearly, and made available to Police as soon as practicable.

(With regards to the above, if your client wishes to add in conditions around the first floor being a restaurant only I'd be happy for it to be 1 SIA)

2- In the event that a serious assault is committed on or directly outside of the premises (where staff witness) or appears to have been committed the management will immediately ensure that:

a) the police (and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service) are called without delay;

b) the crime scene is preserved so as to enable a full forensic investigation to be carried out by the police; and

c) such other measures are taken (as appropriate) to fully protect the safety of all persons present on the premises

3- All front of house staff shall complete welfare and vulnerability awareness training as part of their induction process to work at the premises. This training shall be documented and repeated/refreshed at yearly intervals.

Also further to our original conversation, the policy for challenging ID for protection of children from harm, can this be given consideration to be amended to the following:

4-A challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification

are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS
